Radio: The contest will be broadcast live on the Rutgers Radio Network, WOR 710 AM in New York and WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Chris Carlin will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU (88.7) will also broadcast the game.

Web: The game will be available live via the web at ScarletKnights.com on RVision Presented by AT&T with Danny Breslauer and Adam Helfgott calling the action with Alexa Datt as the courtside reporter.

Rutgers, under the leadership of second-year head coach Mike Rice, hosts Ivy League foe Dartmouth Friday evening in a 7:30 p.m. tip-off at the RAC in the 2011-12 season opener. Fans in attendance will receive a men's basketball schedule poster, sponsored by STS, and magnet, sponsored by Rutgers School of Engineering, while supplies last. The Scarlet Knights have a 72-27 all-time record in game one contests.

Friday evening's match-up will mark the fourth meeting between Rutgers and Dartmouth on the hardwood dating back to 1946, with the Scarlet Knights holding a 2-1 advantage. Rutgers won the last match-up by a 55-50 score at the RAC on Nov. 20, 2007. The teams first met on Dec. 7, 1946, with the Big Green coming away with a 54-48 home victory, before the Scarlet Knight downed Dartmouth on a neutral court, 79-52, on Jan. 4, 1968.

Rutgers returns five scholarship players from a team that posted a 15-17 overall (5-13 BIG EAST) mark last season. Six true freshmen have arrived to supplement a roster that must replace three starting seniors. The task is aided by pair of BIG EAST Conference All-Rookie honorees on the roster in junior wing Dane Miller and sophomore forward Gilydas Biruta. Miller was one of two unanimous selections to the squad in 2009-10 and augmented his game last season by developing into one of the league's top defensive stoppers. Biruta was first among all BIG EAST freshmen last season in rebounding, field goal percentage and free throw percentage.

Rutgers welcomes the highest-rated class in school history into the fold. The class has been ranked in the top 10 nationally by multiple outlets. All of RU's newcomers enrolled in classes this past summer and competed together in an NCAA sanctioned summer league. The true freshmen class is comprised entirely of players ranked among the top 150 recruits nationally. All-American guard Myles Mack, guard Jerome Seagears, guard Eli Carter, forward Malick Kone, forward/center Derrick Randall and forward Greg Lewis.

Dartmouth is under the leadership of Paul Cormier, who rejoined the Big Green as head coach in April 2010 after having previously served in the position for seven seasons (1984-91). Dartmouth is coming off a second straight 5-23 (1-13) season and was tabbed for eighth place in the Ivy League's preseason media poll. The Big Green returns nine letterwinners and welcomes six freshmen into the fold.

RU DEFEATS RUTGERS-NEWARK 80-66 IN EXHIBITION

Freshman guard Eli Carter scored 18 points and rookie forward Malick Kone added 15 points and eight rebounds to help Rutgers to an 80-66 exhibition victory over Rutgers-Newark Sunday afternoon at the RAC. The Scarlet Knights shot 48.4 percent (30-62), including 60 percent in the second half, and out-rebounded the Scarlet Raiders by a 46-33 margin to earn the victory. Carter made seven-of-15 field goals, including four-of-six from behind the arc. Kone shot six-of-10.

Freshman point guard Myles Mack and sophomore forward Gilvydas Biruta also registered double figure scoring totals for the home squad. Mack posted 13 points on three-of-six shooting, while Biruta had 11 points on five-of-six field goals with seven rebounds. Jerome Seagears, part of the highly-touted rookie guard trio along with Carter and Mack, had six points, six rebounds and four assists in 23 minutes. Mack also had four helpers.

The Scarlet Knights limited the visitors to 34.5 percent (20-58) shooting, and just a 21.5 percent mark in the opening half.

RU-Newark scored the contest's first points, but the Scarlet Knights responded with a five point run and never looked back. The home squad led 35-21 at halftime before establishing its largest advantage of 24 points (64-40) with under six minutes remaining.

COACH RICE AT A GLANCE

Head coach Mike Rice enters his second season with a relentless style and heightened expectations. Last year, Rutgers defeated ACC foe Miami and SEC-member Auburn during the non-conference schedule in the midst of a 9-2 start, the best for a first-year coach at RU since 1945. It signaled the first time in 11 years RU had defeated teams from multiple "Big Six/BCS" leagues in the regular season. During the BIG EAST portion, the Scarlet Knights downed No. 9-ranked Villanova in one of college basketball's most thrilling finishes and won two of three against rival Seton Hall. An overtime victory against the Pirates at Madison Square Garden marked RU's first BIG EAST tournament win since 2006.

NO SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS

JACK SIDELINED

Rutgers University head men's basketball coach Mike Rice announced on October 10 that redshirt freshman forward Kadeem Jack was having surgery on his right foot to address an injury that occurred during a preseason workout on Oct. 7. Jack is expected to be sidelined approximately three to four months.

"Kadeem has worked extremely hard in preparation for the season," said Rice. "He will remain very much involved in all team activities and we look forward to his complete recovery."

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

Under Rice, Rutgers basketball has excelled not only on the hardwood, but also in the classroom. All three 2010-11 seniors - Jonathan Mitchell, James Beatty and Mike Coburn - graduated in May. The Scarlet Knights also had three student-athletes recognized as BIG EAST Academic All Stars, including Gilvydas Biruta, who posted a 3.57 grade point average for the academic year.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Rutgers men's basketball program takes a proactive approach to civic responsibility. With the help of director of player development Eric Murdock, Coach Rice has been proactive in the program's efforts to make a difference in the lives of children and the disadvantaged. The team participates in a multitude of community outreach initiatives, including the "Scarlet Letters" pen pal program, "Read Across America" and "Toys for Tots." Rutgers basketball players volunteer at Elijah's Promise soup kitchen in New Brunswick and are active in the NABC's "Ticket to Reading Rewards" program. In addition, players volunteer at the United Way's Gifts for the Season program and deliver toys to children during the holidays via the Student Athlete Advisory Committee Toy Drive. The program's involvement in "Ticket to Reading Rewards" earned notable recognition in May. U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan, NCAA President Mark Emmert, Rice and Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski were among a contingent of dignitaries in a celebration at the Myles J. McManus Middle School in Linden. Rice was also recognized at Yankee Stadium that same month in a pregame ceremony, along with several other coaches, for his involvement with Coaches vs. Cancer. On November 5, Coach Rice and his wife Kerry hosted a tip-off dinner at the Rutgers Athletic Center on Friday evening to benefit the American Cancer Society and its Coaches vs. Cancer program. THE COACHES' KIDS

Four members of the RU coaching staff followed in their father's footsteps - head coach Mike Rice, assistant coach Jimmy Martelli, coordinator of operations/video Corky McMullen and assistant to the head coach Brad Wachtel.

Rice - Son of Mike Rice Sr., head coach at Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87). Rice coached for 13 years at the high school level, posting a career record of 245-71, before moving to college coaching in 1977. In four seasons at Duquesne, Rice amassed a 62-49 record, earning two berths in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) and twice being named the Eastern Eight Coach of the Year. At Youngstown State, Rice picked up 75 wins in five years, as the Penguins twice finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Martelli - Son of Phil Martelli, the current head coach of Saint Joseph's in Philadelphia. Martelli is in his 17th season with the Hawks, coming into the year with a 300-209 record, including 17 postseason wins. Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories six times in 16 seasons and was the 2004 Consensus National Coach of the Year.

McMullen – Son of Tim McMullen, the current head coach of Letchworth High School in western New York. McMullen – who began coaching in 1983 – has won over 300 games with the Indians. McMullen led the squad to its only sectional championship in 1999, with Corky on the squad, and the school's lone Livingston County Division II championship in 2007.

Wachtel – Son of Artie Wachtel, former assistant coach at Long Island University and head coach of Perth Amboy Tech. Wachtel spent 18 years with the Blackbirds, working with head coach Paul Lizzo from 1976-1994. In 1995, Wachtel became the head coach of the Patriots.

Mike Rice enters his second season "On the Banks" in 2011-12 on the heels of an intriguing 2010-11 campaign and with the highest-rated recruiting class in school history in tow. The 17th head coach in the history of the Rutgers men's basketball program, the Pittsburgh, Pa. native has made a definite impact on Garden State hoops and will continue to push the Scarlet Knights to greater heights with a relentless style that has become his trademark.

Rice balances an indomitable courtside manner with an approachable, self-deprecating persona off the court. The resulting dynamic

has paid early dividends for an RU fan base hungry for postseason returns. With just eight scholarship players on the roster last season, the Scarlet Knights earned many notable victories. Off the court, enthusiasm for the program is tangible with a top 10 ranked recruiting class poised to call Piscataway home for the next four years.

Rice wasted little time making his mark in 2010-11. The Scarlet Knights' 9-2 beginning marked the best start for a first-year head coach at RU since Donald S. White began his tenure with a 10-2 record in 1945-46. Included were wins over ACC foe Miami and SEC-member Auburn. It signaled the first time Rutgers had defeated teams from multiple "Big Six/BCS" leagues in the regular season since Nov. 1999.

The nonconference success extended to the always rugged BIG EAST conference campaign. Rutgers downed No. 9-ranked Villanova at home in one of college basketball's most thrilling finishes and won two of three against rival Seton Hall. An overtime victory against the Pirates at Madison Square Garden marked RU's first BIG EAST tournament win since 2006.

Rice was named the Rutgers' 2010-11 Coach of the Year by the University's student newspaper, the Daily Targum.

Jonathan Mitchell and Gilydas Biruta earned accolades both on and off the court under Rice. Mitchell was an All-Metropolitan selection and was joined by fellow senior tri-captains James Beatty and Mike Coburn in their caps and gowns, as all three earned diplomas in May. Biruta was a BIG EAST All-Rookie honoree and capped his freshman campaign with a 3.57 cumulative grade point average.

The success on the court and in the classroom also extends into the community. With the help of Director of Player Development Eric Murdock, Rice has been proactive in the program's efforts to make a difference in the lives of children and the disadvantaged. The team participates in a multitude of community outreach initiatives, including the "Scarlet Letters" pen pal program, "Read Across America" and "Toys for Tots." Rutgers basketball players also volunteer at Elijah's Promise soup kitchen in New Brunswick and are active in the NABC's "Ticket to Reading Rewards" program. In addition, players volunteer at the United Way's Gifts for the Season program and deliver toys to children during the holidays via the Student Athlete Advisory Committee Toy Drive.

The program's involvement in "Ticket to Reading Rewards" earned notable recognition in May. U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan, NCAA President Mark Emmert, Rice and Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski were among a contingent of dignitaries in a celebration at the Myles J. McManus Middle School in Linden. Rice was also recognized at Yankee Stadium that same month in a pregame ceremony, along with several other coaches, for his involvement with Coaches vs. Cancer.

Rice compiled a 73-31 (.702) record as head coach at Robert Morris University en route to three consecutive postseason appearances and a pair of NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament berths before being named head coach at Rutgers.

Rice signed a five-year contract through the 2014-15 season.

A graduate of Fordham University in New York, Rice has made 10 NCAA or NIT appearances as either a head or assistant coach during his 17-year tenure in the collegiate coaching ranks.

Rice directed Robert Morris to first place, regular season finishes in each of his three seasons (2007-08 to 2009-10) and captured back-to-back Northeast Conference Tournament championships in 2009 and 2010. He was named

the NABC District Coach of the Year, as well as NEC Jim Phelan Coach of the Year, in both 2008 and 2009. A total of 17 school records were either tied or broken under Rice's watch, including victories (26 in 2007-08), NEC wins (16 in 2007-08) and consecutive victories (14 in 2007-08). RMU also posted 15-straight NEC road wins over the course of the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons, a conference record.

In 2009-10, Rice directed Robert Morris to a 23-12 (15-3 NEC) record. The Colonials' season came to a close in a hard-fought, 73-70, overtime loss to No. 2-seeded Villanova in an NCAA opening round contest in Providence, R.I. In 2008-09, RMU posted a 24-11 (15-3 NEC) mark and lost 77-62 to No. 2-seeded and eventual national finalist Michigan State in Minneapolis, Minn. In 2007-08, the Colonials had a 26-8 (16-2 NEC) record and concluded its campaign with an 87-81 NIT loss to No. 1-seeded Syracuse at the Carrier Dome.

Prior to assuming the reins at RMU, Rice served as an assistant and primary recruiter at the University of Pittsburgh under head coach Jamie Dixon in 2006-07. He helped the Panthers to a second-place regular season finish and a spot in the BIG EAST Championship final before the team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Pitt finished with an overall record of 29-8 and Rice was instrumental in attracting a 2007-08 recruiting class that was ranked 16th by Scouts, Inc. and 12th by Hoop Scoop.

From 2004 to 2006, Rice was an assistant under head coach Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia, Pa. He helped the Hawks to a combined record of 43-26 (623) and a pair of NIT bids. In 2004-05, Saint Joseph's finished with a 24-12 record and advanced to the NIT final.

Rice began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater following his graduation, before serving as an assistant coach at Marquette (1994-97), Niagara (1997-98) and Chicago State (1998-2001). At Marquette, Rice was instrumental in helping the Golden Eagles to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in 1996 and 1997. Marquette claimed the 1997 Conference USA Tournament championship and finished as the NIT runner-up in 1995.

A 1991 graduate of Fordham with a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications, Rice was a three-year starter for the Rams at guard. He appeared in 117 career games, serving as captain of the 1990-91 squad that posted 25-8 record and earned an NIT berth. Rice's 152 assists during his senior campaign rank as the sixth highest single-season output in school history.

Rice and his wife Kerry are the proud parents of two children, son Michael (13) and daughter Katie (11). From an athletic family, Rice's mother, Kathy, played basketball at Duquesne, while his sisters, Susan and Stephanie, both played tennis at Syracuse. His father, Mike Rice Sr., served as head men's basketball coach at both Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87) and currently works as the television color commentator for the NBA's Portland Trailblazers.
