TV: The game will be televised live nationally in high definition on ESPN2 with Bob Wischusen calling the action and Derrick Whittenburg providing the analysis.

Radio: The contest will be broadcast live on the Rutgers Radio Network, WOR 710 AM in New York and WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Chris Carlin will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU (88.7 FM) will also broadcast the game.

After consecutive road games, Rutgers returns to the friendly confines of the RAC to meet Garden State rival Seton Hall Wednesday evening in a 9 p.m. tip-off. The Scarlet Knights will be working to snap a two game skid, while the Pirates will be looking to end a string of six consecutive defeats. Wednesday's game marks the first of the home-and-home series this regular season, with RU slated to make a return visit to the Prudential Center on Feb. 25.

Wednesday evening's contest marks the 61st meeting between the schools on the collegiate hardwood dating back to 1916, with Seton Hall holding a 34-26 advantage in victories. Thirteen of the last 15 meetings have been decided by six points or less or in overtime. Rutgers is 15-14 all-time at home versus the Pirates. In BIG EAST regular-season play, SHU holds a 19-10 lead. The teams met three times last season, with each club winning on the opponent's home floor during the regular season and RU capturing a 76-70 overtime win in the opening round of the BIG EAST Championship. Four Scarlet Knights posted double-figures in that win at Madison Square Garden, including senior Jonathan Mitchell, who tied a career high with 25 points.

Both Rutgers and Seton Hall are among the nation's top teams in steals. The Scarlet Knights rank 26th nationally with 8.6 per game, while the Pirates place 17th with 8.8 thefts per contest.

Rutgers is coming off a 78-66 loss at No. 25 Louisville Saturday afternoon before 21,298 fans at the KFC Yum! Center. Freshman guard Eli Carter shot nine-of-17 to score 24 points, a personal-best in BIG EAST play, with six rebounds. Fellow rookie Myles Mack added nine points and three steals. The Cardinals out-rebounded RU 40-25 en route to an 18-2 advantage in second chance points and a 38-22 margin in points in the paint. Louisville made 24-of-32 free throw attempts, while the Scarlet Knights deposited eight-of-nine from the charity stripe.

Seton Hall, under the leadership of second-year head coach Kevin Willard, dropped a 69-46 decision at Connecticut Saturday afternoon. Without senior forward Herb Pope in the lineup, the Pirates shot a season-low 25.9 percent (15-58) and were out-scored 30-18 in the paint. Guards Jordan Theodore and Fuquan Edwin both scored 10 points in the defeat. Pope leads SHU in both scoring (15.9) and rebounding (10.2) and is one of just two BIG EAST players (West Virginia's Kevin Jones) to average a double-double. Edwin leads the nation in steals (3.09), while Theodore ranks second in the league and sixth nationally in assists (6.78). In BIG EAST play, the Pirates are averaging 9.0 steals-per-game.

ELI CARTER NAMED BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK ON JAN 2

Rutgers freshman guard Eli Carter was named the BIG EAST Conference Rookie of the Week on Jan. 2 after averaging 27.0 points, 4.5 assists, 4.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals while shooting 50 percent (21-of-42) to help the Scarlet Knights to a 1-1 record. Carter shot 12-of-24 to score a career-high 31 points to help Rutgers to an 85-83 double overtime over No. 10 Florida on Dec. 29 at the RAC. The scoring output marked the most for an RU freshman in a game since Quincy Douby posted 35 in an overtime 84-81 NIT semifinal win over Iowa State in 2004 and signaled the most for an RU freshman in a regular season contest since Tom Savage scored 33 points in an 87-72 win over St. Bonaventure on Feb. 22, 1988. Carter played 46 of a possible 50 minutes against the Gators and added seven rebounds with seven assists. On Jan. 1 in the BIG EAST opener at USF, Carter shot nine-of-18, including four-of-nine from behind the arc, to score a game-high 23 points. He also had a game-high five steals versus the Bulls. Carter scored 18 second half points on seven-of-nine field goals, helping the Scarlet Knights respond to a nine point deficit.

TEAM SEASON NOTABLES

- The 23-point win at Pitt marked the greatest margin of victory on the road in the BIG EAST for the Scarlet Knights. It was the largest margin of victory over a BIG EAST opponent since Feb. 15, 2004 (33 points, 85-52) against Virginia Tech – the Rutgers record in a BIG EAST game.
- RU held Pitt to .211 shooting, the lowest field goal percentage Rutgers has held a BIG EAST team and the lowest since Nov. 28, 2001 against Stony Brook (10-for-49, .204).
- The 39 points surrendered at Pitt were the fewest allowed by Rutgers to a BIG EAST opponent.
- The 39 points allowed by Rutgers were the fewest for Pitt since Dec. 1973 and the fewest at home since Jan. 1950. It marked the fewest scored by Pitt in a BIG EAST game.
- Coming into the game as the No. 1 team in the nation in rebounding margin (+13.3), Rutgers outrebounded Pittsburgh by a 16-point margin (51-35).
- The 67-60 win over No. 8 UConn signaled the first RU victory in program history over a defending national champion (1-11). The last (and only) time RU downed two top-10 opponents in the same season was 1981-82 (No. 8 UCLA and No. 6 West Virginia).
- The win over UConn was the ninth over a top-10 team in Rutgers history. Head coach Mike Rice has defeated three top-10 AP ranked squads, the second-most for a RU head coach. Tom Young had four wins over top-10 opponents during his tenure. The Scarlet Knights have defeated the last three top-10 teams to enter the RAC and four since Feb. 14, 2010.
- Rutgers downed Connecticut for the first time since 2002 and just the second time since 1979 in 21 meetings.
- The victory over No. 10 UF marked the highest ranked, non conference opponent Rutgers has defeated since a 57-54 win over No. 8 UCLA on Dec. 3, 1981.
- Rutgers outrebounded NJIT (Dec. 22) by a 51-28 (23-board) margin. The last time RU outrebounded an opponent by a greater margin was Nov. 26, 2001 against Stony Brook. RU grabbed 50 rebounds to SBU's 21 (29-rebound margin).
- The 27 assists dished out by Rutgers against UMBC (11/28) marked its most since Dec. 7, 1992 (32) in a 132-83 win over Keene State at the RAC. The RU record for most assists in a game came against Boston College (W, 102-92) on Jan. 15, 1977 (33).
- RU's 94-56 win over UMBC was its biggest margin of victory (38 points) over a Division I team since Dec. 7, 2005, when RU downed Maryland Eastern Shore 92-50.
- Versus Sacred Heart (11/17), Rutgers had six players score in double-figures for the first time since Dec. 7, 2005, when RU beat Maryland Eastern Shore, 92-50.

RUTGERS-SYRACUSE GAME SOLD OUT

Rutgers Athletics announced on Jan. 19 that the BIG EAST men's basketball match-up between the host Scarlet Knights and Syracuse on Sunday, Feb. 19 is sold out. Rutgers has defeated the last three top ten-ranked teams to play at the RAC, including No. 10 Florida and No. 8 Connecticut this season.

RU PLAYERS HAIL FROM TOP METRO PROGRAMS

Under head coach Mike Rice, Rutgers has compiled a roster filled with players from the top high school and prep programs in the metro area. Freshman guards Myles Mack and Eli Carter both played at the legendary St. Anthony HS in Jersey City under Naismith Hall of Fame head Coach Bob Hurley. The duo did not play together, however and were actually rivals in high school. Carter was SAHS's leading scoring during his senior season in 2009-10, when he averaged 15.2 points to help the Friars to a 27-3 record and the NJSIAA Non-Public North B title with a win over previously unbeaten and No. 3-ranked nationally Paterson Catholic at the RAC. In that title game, Carter had 28 points and 14 rebounds to defeat a team that featured current RU teammates Myles Mack and Derrick Randall. Paterson Catholic had defeated SAHS earlier in the season and entered that game 28-0.

After the 2009-10 school year, PC closed its doors and Mack transferred to St. Anthony for his senior season and Randall prepped a season at the South Kent School. As a senior at senior at SAHS, Mack was the only player to start every game, earning first team All-America honors while leading the Friars to a 33-0 record and a consensus high school national championship.

Sophomores Gilvydas Biruta and Mike Poole also competed scholastically in the Hurley family tree, under son Dan at St. Benedict's Preparatory in Newark. They played their junior and senior season together for the Grey Bees, helping the team to a 20-1 record and a No. 4 final national ranking as seniors in 2009-10 and a No. 7 final national ranking and a 24-3 mark in 2008-09. Redshirt freshman Kadeem Jack is a graduate of New York's storied Rice HS, which has also closed its doors. The nation's No. 33 overall recruit at the time of his signing, Jack was a First team all city and All-State selection as a senior at Rice in 2009-10.

PLAYING THE BEST FOR ALL TO SEE

Rutgers will play 11 nationally televised games, including nine on the ESPN network (ESPN/ESPN2/ESPNU), to highlight its 2011-12 schedule. Every regular season RU game is televised in some form, whether or it be national or regional television, or via the web (ESPN3 and RVision). The Scarlet Knights will play 16 teams (15 NCAA, 1 NIT) that earned postseason bids in 2010-11, resulting in 18 of 31 games this season against postseason opponents.

BIRUTA NAMED CANCUN CHALLENGE ALL-TOURNAMENT

Rutgers sophomore forward Gilyvdas Biruta was named to the 2011 Cancun Challenge Riviera Division All-Tournament Team. In the two contests played at the Moon Palace Resort, Biruta averaged 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds. Biruta was joined on the team by Tournament MVP D.J. Richardson and Sam Maniscalco of Illinois, Richmond's Darien Brothers and John Wilkins and John Ekey of Illinois State. Biruta had 11 points and seven rebounds versus Illinois State on Tuesday evening before posting 14 points and four rebounds against Richmond Wednesday night.

SHOTS FROM THE HEART

Mike Rice was one of 64 Division I men's basketball coaches participating in the Second Annual Shots from the Heart Tournament. The coaches compete in a free-throw shooting contest to help raise awareness for the growing problem of heart disease. The event, which also includes a tournament for assistant coaches, benefits the Skip Prosser Foundation. The former Wake Forest head coach passed away on July 26, 2007 of a heart attack. With a video camera rolling, Rice took his 25 free throws on Friday, Nov. 18. He missed just one, one-point, free throw – the fourth taken overall – to tally an impressive 55 point total. Rice's first round opponent was Delaware head coach Monte Ross. Ross took his free throws on Wed., Nov. 23 and was a perfect 25-of-25. Ross and Rice served together as assistants at St. Joseph's under Phil Martelli and shared an office. Ross advances to compete against the winner of the match between Detroit's Ray McCallum and Ohio's John Groce. The entire field of 64 bracket can be viewed at collegeinsider.com/shots.

NO SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS

The Scarlet Knights do not have a scholarship senior on the active roster, but have five experienced players in the form of returning starters Miller and Biruta and

returning letterwinners Austin Johnson, Mike Poole and Austin Carroll. RU had to replace of trio of starting seniors from the 2010-11 season, including All-MET performer Jonathan Mitchell. The active seniors on the roster are walk-on contributors are guard Mike Kuhn and Charlie Rigoglioso. Both are instrumental members of the scout team and have earned BIG EAST Academic All-Star accolades during their tenures "On the Banks." Kuhn is chronicling his senior campaign throughout the season via a popular blog that can be viewed on the men's basketball page at ScarletKnights.com/kuhnskorner.

HIGHEST RATED RECRUITING CLASS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Rutgers welcomes the highest-rated class in school history into the fold. The class has been ranked in the top 10 nationally by multiple outlets. All of RU's newcomers enrolled in classes this past summer and competed together in an NCAA sanctioned summer league. The true freshmen class is comprised entirely of players ranked among the top 150 recruits nationally: All-American guard Myles Mack (No. 62 overall by ESPN), guard Jerome Seagears (No. 89 overall by Scout), guard Eli Carter (114 overall by Rivals), wing Malick Kone (No. 145 overall by Hoop Scoop), forward/center Derrick Randall (119 overall by Hoop Scoop) and forward Greg Lewis (127 overall by Hoop Scoop).

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

Under Rice, Rutgers basketball has excelled not only on the hardwood, but also in the classroom. All three 2010-11 seniors – Jonathan Mitchell, James Beatty and Mike Coburn – graduated in May. The Scarlet Knights also had three student-athletes recognized as BIG EAST Academic All Stars, including Gilyvdas Biruta, who posted a 3.57 grade point average for the academic year. In the fall 2011 semester, nine Rutgers players had grade point averages of 3.0 or above.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Rutgers men's basketball program takes a proactive approach to civic responsibility. With the help of director of player development Eric Murdock, Coach Rice has been proactive in the program's efforts to make a difference in the lives of children and the disadvantaged. The team participates in a multitude of community outreach initiatives, including the "Scarlet Letters" pen pal program, "Read Across America" and "Toys for Tots." Rutgers basketball players volunteer at Elijah's Promise soup kitchen in New Brunswick and are active in the NABC's "Ticket to Reading Rewards" program. In addition, players volunteer at the United Way's Gifts for the Season program and deliver toys to children during the holidays via the Student Athlete Advisory Committee Toy Drive. The program's involvement in "Ticket to Reading Rewards" earned notable recognition in May. U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan, NCAA President Mark Emmert, Rice and Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski were among a contingent of dignitaries in a celebration at the Myles J. McManus Middle School in Linden. Rice was also recognized at Yankee Stadium that same month in a pregame ceremony, along with several other coaches, for his involvement with Coaches vs. Cancer. On November 5, Coach Rice and his wife Kerry hosted a tip-off dinner at the Rutgers Athletic Center on Friday evening to benefit the American Cancer Society and its Coaches vs. Cancer program.

THE COACHES' KIDS

Four members of the RU coaching staff followed in their father's footsteps – head coach Mike Rice, assistant coach Jimmy Martelli, coordinator of operations/video Corky McMullen and assistant to the head coach Brad Wachtel. **Rice** – Son of Mike Rice Sr., head coach at Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87). Rice coached for 13 years at the high school level, posting a career record of 245-71, before moving to college coaching in 1977. In four seasons at Duquesne, Rice amassed a 62-49 record, earning two berths in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) and twice being named the Eastern Eight Coach of the Year. At Youngstown State, Rice picked up 75 wins in five years, as the Penguins twice finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference. **Martelli** – Son of Phil Martelli, the current head coach of Saint Joseph's in Philadelphia. Martelli is in his 17th season with the Hawks, coming into the year with a 300-209 record, including 17 postseason wins. Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories six times in 16 seasons and was the 2004 Consensus National Coach of the Year. **McMullen** – Son of Tim McMullen, the current head coach of Letchworth High School in western New York. McMullen – who began coaching in 1983 – has won over 300 games with the Indians. McMullen led the squad to its only sectional championship in 1999, with Corky on the squad, and the school's lone Livingston County Division II championship in 2007. **Wachtel** – Son of Artie Wachtel, former assistant coach at Long Island University and head coach of Perth Amboy Tech. Wachtel spent 18 years with the Blackbirds, working with head coach Paul Lizzo from 1976-1994. In 1995, Wachtel became the head coach of the Patriots.

Mike Rice enters his second season "On the Banks" in 2011-12 on the heels of an intriguing 2010-11 campaign and with the highest-rated recruiting class in school history in tow. The 17th head coach in the history of the Rutgers men's basketball program, the Pittsburgh, Pa. native has made a definite impact on Garden State hoops and will continue to push the Scarlet Knights to greater heights with a relentless style that has become his trademark.

Rice balances an indomitable courtside manner with an approachable, self-deprecating persona off the court. The resulting dynamic

has paid early dividends for an RU fan base hungry for postseason returns. With just eight scholarship players on the roster last season, the Scarlet Knights earned many notable victories. Off the court, enthusiasm for the program is tangible with a top 10 ranked recruiting class poised to call Piscataway home for the next four years.

Rice wasted little time making his mark in 2010-11. The Scarlet Knights' 9-2 beginning marked the best start for a first-year head coach at RU since Donald S. White began his tenure with a 10-2 record in 1945-46. Included were wins over ACC foe Miami and SEC-member Auburn. It signaled the first time Rutgers had defeated teams from multiple "Big Six/BCS" leagues in the regular season since Nov. 1999.

The nonconference success extended to the always rugged BIG EAST conference campaign. Rutgers downed No. 9-ranked Villanova at home in one of college basketball's most thrilling finishes and won two of three against rival Seton Hall. An overtime victory against the Pirates at Madison Square Garden marked RU's first BIG EAST tournament win since 2006.

Rice was named the Rutgers' 2010-11 Coach of the Year by the University's student newspaper, the Daily Targum.

Jonathan Mitchell and Gilydas Biruta earned accolades both on and off the court under Rice. Mitchell was an All-Metropolitan selection and was joined by fellow senior tri-captains James Beatty and Mike Coburn in their caps and gowns, as all three earned diplomas in May. Biruta was a BIG EAST All-Rookie honoree and capped his freshman campaign with a 3.57 cumulative grade point average.

The success on the court and in the classroom also extends into the community. With the help of Director of Player Development Eric Murdock, Rice has been proactive in the program's efforts to make a difference in the lives of children and the disadvantaged. The team participates in a multitude of community outreach initiatives, including the "Scarlet Letters" pen pal program, "Read Across America" and "Toys for Tots." Rutgers basketball players also volunteer at Elijah's Promise soup kitchen in New Brunswick and are active in the NABC's "Ticket to Reading Rewards" program. In addition, players volunteer at the United Way's Gifts for the Season program and deliver toys to children during the holidays via the Student Athlete Advisory Committee Toy Drive.

The program's involvement in "Ticket to Reading Rewards" earned notable recognition in May. U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan, NCAA President Mark Emmert, Rice and Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski were among a contingent of dignitaries in a celebration at the Myles J. McManus Middle School in Linden. Rice was also recognized at Yankee Stadium that same month in a pregame ceremony, along with several other coaches, for his involvement with Coaches vs. Cancer.

Rice compiled a 73-31 (.702) record as head coach at Robert Morris University en route to three consecutive postseason appearances and a pair of NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament berths before being named head coach at Rutgers.

Rice signed a five-year contract through the 2014-15 season.

A graduate of Fordham University in New York, Rice has made 10 NCAA or NIT appearances as either a head or assistant coach during his 17-year tenure in the collegiate coaching ranks.

Rice directed Robert Morris to first place, regular season finishes in each of his three seasons (2007-08 to 2009-10) and captured back-to-back Northeast Conference Tournament championships in 2009 and 2010. He was named

the NABC District Coach of the Year, as well as NEC Jim Phelan Coach of the Year, in both 2008 and 2009. A total of 17 school records were either tied or broken under Rice's watch, including victories (26 in 2007-08), NEC wins (16 in 2007-08) and consecutive victories (14 in 2007-08). RMU also posted 15-straight NEC road wins over the course of the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons, a conference record.

In 2009-10, Rice directed Robert Morris to a 23-12 (15-3 NEC) record. The Colonials' season came to a close in a hard-fought, 73-70, overtime loss to No. 2-seeded Villanova in an NCAA opening round contest in Providence, R.I. In 2008-09, RMU posted a 24-11 (15-3 NEC) mark and lost 77-62 to No. 2-seeded and eventual national finalist Michigan State in Minneapolis, Minn. In 2007-08, the Colonials had a 26-8 (16-2 NEC) record and concluded its campaign with an 87-81 NIT loss to No. 1-seeded Syracuse at the Carrier Dome.

Prior to assuming the reins at RMU, Rice served as an assistant and primary recruiter at the University of Pittsburgh under head coach Jamie Dixon in 2006-07. He helped the Panthers to a second-place regular season finish and a spot in the BIG EAST Championship final before the team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Pitt finished with an overall record of 29-8 and Rice was instrumental in attracting a 2007-08 recruiting class that was ranked 16th by Scouts, Inc. and 12th by Hoop Scoop.

From 2004 to 2006, Rice was an assistant under head coach Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia, Pa. He helped the Hawks to a combined record of 43-26 (623) and a pair of NIT bids. In 2004-05, Saint Joseph's finished with a 24-12 record and advanced to the NIT final.

Rice began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater following his graduation, before serving as an assistant coach at Marquette (1994-97), Niagara (1997-98) and Chicago State (1998-2001). At Marquette, Rice was instrumental in helping the Golden Eagles to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in 1996 and 1997. Marquette claimed the 1997 Conference USA Tournament championship and finished as the NIT runner-up in 1995.

A 1991 graduate of Fordham with a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications, Rice was a three-year starter for the Rams at guard. He appeared in 117 career games, serving as captain of the 1990-91 squad that posted 25-8 record and earned an NIT berth. Rice's 152 assists during his senior campaign rank as the sixth highest single-season output in school history.

Rice and his wife Kerry are the proud parents of two children, son Michael (13) and daughter Katie (11). From an athletic family, Rice's mother, Kathy, played basketball at Duquesne, while his sisters, Susan and Stephanie, both played tennis at Syracuse. His father, Mike Rice Sr., served as head men's basketball coach at both Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87) and currently works as the television color commentator for the NBA's Portland Trailblazers.

- Eli Carter and Myles Mack both earned their first starts in a Rutgers uniform. Dane Miller got the nod for a team-best 50th-straight contest.
- Carter, Mack, Malick Kone, Greg Lewis, Derrick Randall, and Jerome Seagears all saw their first action for the Scarlet Knights.
- Of the 11 players that saw action, eight had four-plus points and six tallied seven-plus.

- Eli Carter registered double-digits for the fourth time this season with 12 points.
- For the seventh time in his career, Mike Poole scored 10-plus with 13 points.
- Gilydyas Biruta scored 13 points, the 24th time in his career the sophomore has gone for double-figures.

- Dane Miller recorded his third double-double over the last six games with 10 points and 12 rebounds. The junior has nine for his career.
- Miller grabbed 10-plus rebounds for the fourth time this season and third time in the last six contests.
- Myles Mack hit double-digits for the 12th time this season with 10 points.
- RU moves to 10-2 when outshooting its opponent.
- The Scarlet Knights dominated the paint, outscoring the Bearcats 30-12 inside the key.
- The RU defense held Cincinnati to nine-of-30 (.300) shooting in the first half. Coming into the game averaging 69.9 points, the Scarlet Knights held the Bearcats to 54 points. For the game, RU held UC to .357 percent from the floor.
- Of the eight Scarlet Knights that saw action, all eight scored at least a basket with five registering seven-plus.
