**TV** The game will be televised live nationally on ESPNU with Mike Crispino calling the action and Tim Welsh offering the analysis.

**Radio:** The contest will be broadcast live on the Rutgers Radio Network, WOR 710 AM in New York and WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Chris Carlin will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU (88.7) will also broadcast the game.

Rutgers looks to improve to a perfect 5-0 at home when it welcomes LSU to the RAC on Saturday for a 7 p.m. tip-off. The game is part of the inaugural BIG EAST/SEC Challenge. Last season, the Scarlet Knights downed Auburn 63-54 at the Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh in the previously named SEC/BIG EAST Invitational. The Rutgers Student Athlete Advisory Committee is sponsoring a Toy Drive for the contest versus the Tigers. Fans are invited to bring new, unwrapped books and toys for the area's neediest children. Representatives from Rutgers SAAC will be on hand to collect donations.

The contest will mark the first meeting on the collegiate hardwood between the Scarlet Knights and Tigers. It signals the fifth game this season (Sacred Heart, Hampton, Illinois State, Richmond) and the fifth time in six games that Rutgers will be squaring off against an opponent for the first time in its history. RU has a 5-12 all-time record against current members of the SEC.

Rutgers is coming off a dominant 94-56 victory over UMBC Monday evening at the RAC. The Scarlet Knights dished-out 27 assists, their most since 1992. Point guard Myles Mack shot 7-of-9, including three-of-four from behind the arc, to score a game and career-high 20 points. He combined with fellow freshmen guards Jerome Seagears and Eli Carter to score 39 points on 14-of-21 shooting with 13 assists. Seagears had 10 rebounds and five steals, while Carter connected on four-of-six shots to tally 12 points. Rutgers shot 55.7 percent (34-61), including an impressive 58.8 percent (10-17) mark from behind the arc. The Retrievers made just 36 percent (18-50) of their field goals thanks to a stingy RU defense that also forced 20 turnovers. Gilydas Biruta, who was recently named to the Cancun Challenge Riviera Division All-Tournament Team, shot five-of-six to score 13 points versus UMBC. He leads the Scarlet Knights in both scoring (12.1) and rebounding (6.4).

LSU, under the leadership of fourth-year head coach Trent Johnson, is coming off a 59-58 comeback victory at Houston Tuesday night. Senior forward Storm Warren deposited a pair of free throws with 1.2 seconds on the clock to ensure the win. The Tigers, who committed just five second half turnovers, erased a 38-30 halftime deficit. Warren was one of four players to compile double figures for LSU. He finished with 12 points on 4-of-8 shooting off the bench. Sophomore guard Andre Stringer is averaging 12.0 points-per-game to pace a balanced scoring attack for the Tigers that features four players in double digits.

## QUICK HITS

- Rutgers is 15-5 all-time on games played on Dec. 3 and has won its last 12 contests on the date. The Scarlet Knights last played on Dec. 3 in 2009 and defeated Princeton 58-44 at the RAC.
- Saturday evening's contest will mark the first meeting on the collegiate hardwood between the Scarlet Knights and Tigers.
- The Scarlet Knights are 5-12 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference. RU last played an SEC member last season, defeating Auburn 63-54 at the Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh in the SEC/BIG EAST Invitational.

## BIG EAST/SEC CHALLENGE

The inaugural BIG EAST/SEC Challenge is a three-day men's basketball event matching 12 teams from each of the premier conferences against each other December 1-3. ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3.com will combine to televise all 12 games.

The inaugural Challenge involves nine teams ranked in the early preseason top 25 by ESPN.com senior college basketball writer Andy Katz: No. 2 Kentucky, No. 4 Syracuse, No. 6 Connecticut, No. 7 Vanderbilt, No. 9 Louisville, No. 12 Florida, No. 14 Alabama, No. 17 Pittsburgh and No. 19 Cincinnati. Overall, the field of 24 consists of 13 teams from the 2011 NCAA Tournament (eight from the BIG EAST and five from the Southeastern Conference).

All 12 games will be played at home sites with each conference hosting six games a year. SEC teams will alternate home and away games. Twelve BIG EAST teams will participate each year. The event title will alternate to the SEC/ BIG EAST Challenge in 2012 and be played Thursday, Nov. 29 through Saturday, Dec. 1.

## SEASON NOTABLES

- Rutgers is 4-0 at home, 3-0 when scoring the game's first points and 3-0 when leading at halftime this season.
- The 27 assists dished out by Rutgers against UMBC (11/28) marked its most since Dec. 7, 1992 (32) in a 132-83 win over Keene State at the RAC. The RU record for most assists in a game came against Boston College (W, 102-92) on Jan. 15, 1977 (33).
- RU's 94-56 win over UMBC was its biggest margin of victory (38 points) over a Division I team since Dec. 7, 2005, when RU downed Maryland Eastern Shore 92-50.
- Versus Sacred Heart (11/17), Rutgers had six players score in double-figures for the first time since Dec. 7, 2005, when RU beat Maryland Eastern Shore, 92-50.

## BIRUTA NAMED CANCUN CHALLENGE ALL-TOURNAMENT

Rutgers sophomore forward Gilvydas Biruta was named to the 2011 Cancun Challenge Riviera Division All-Tournament Team. In the two contests played at the Moon Palace Resort, Biruta averaged 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds.

Biruta was joined on the team by Tournament MVP D.J. Richardson and Sam Maniscalco of Illinois, Richmond's Darien Brothers and John Wilkins and John Ekey of Illinois State.

Biruta had 11 points and seven rebounds versus Illinois State on Tuesday evening before posting 14 points and four rebounds against Richmond Wednesday night. For the season, Biruta leads the Scarlet Knights in both scoring and rebounding, averaging 12.1 points and 6.4 rebounds-per-game, while also shooting a team-best 55 percent (33-60).

## RU PLAYERS HAIL FROM TOP METRO PROGRAMS

Under head coach Mike Rice, Rutgers has compiled a roster filled with players from the top high school and prep programs in the metro area. Freshman guards Myles Mack and Eli Carter both played at the legendary St. Anthony HS in Jersey City under Naismith Hall of Fame head Coach Bob Hurley. The duo did not play together, however and were actually rivals in high school. Carter was SAHS's leading scoring during his senior season in 2009-10, when he averaged 15.2 points to help the Friars to a 27-3 record and the NJSIAA Non-Public North B title with a win over previously unbeaten and No. 3-ranked nationally Paterson Catholic at the RAC. In that title game, Carter had 28 points and 14 rebounds to defeat a team that featured current RU teammates Myles Mack and Derrick Randall. Paterson Catholic had defeated SAHS earlier in the season and entered that game 28-0.

After the 2009-10 school year, PC closed its doors and Mack transferred to St. Anthony for his senior season and Randall prepped a season at the South Kent School. As a senior at senior at SAHS, Mack was the only player to start every game, earning first team All-America honors while leading the Friars to a 33-0 record and a consensus high school national championship.

Sophomores Gilvydas Biruta and Mike Poole also competed scholastically in the Hurley family tree, under son Dan at St. Benedict's Preparatory in Newark. They played their junior and senior season together for the Grey Bees, helping the team to a 20-1 record and a No. 4 final national ranking as seniors in 2009-10 and a No. 7 final national ranking and a 24-3 mark in 2008-09.

## PLAYING THE BEST FOR ALL TO SEE

Rutgers will play 11 nationally televised games, including nine on the ESPN network (ESPN/ESPN2/ESPNU), to highlight its 2011-12 schedule. Every regular season RU game is televised in some form, whether or it be national or regional television, or via the web (ESPN3 and RVision). The Scarlet Knights will play 16 teams (15 NCAA, 1 NIT) that earned postseason bids in 2010-11, resulting in 18 of 31 games this season against postseason opponents.

## SHOTS FROM THE HEART

Mike Rice was one of 64 Division I men's basketball coaches participating in the Second Annual Shots from the Heart Tournament. The coaches compete in a free-throw shooting contest to help raise awareness for the growing problem of heart disease. The event, which also includes a tournament for assistant coaches, benefits the Skip Prosser Foundation. The former Wake Forest head coach passed away on July 26, 2007 of a heart attack.

With a video camera rolling, Rice took his 25 free throws on Friday, November 18. He missed just one, one-point, free throw - the fourth taken overall - to tally an impressive 55 point total.

Rice's first round opponent was Delaware head coach Monte Ross. Ross took his free throws on Wed., Nov. 23 and was a perfect 25-of-25. Ross and Rice served together as assistants at St. Joseph's under Phil Martelli and shared an office. Ross advances to compete against the winner of the match between

### NO SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS

The Scarlet Knights do not have a scholarship senior on the active roster, but have five experienced players in the form of returning starters Miller and Biruta and returning letterwinners Austin Johnson, Mike Poole and Austin Carroll. RU is faced with having to replace of trio of starting seniors from the 2010-11 season, including All-MET performer Jonathan Mitchell.

The active seniors on the roster are walk-on contributors are guard Mike Kuhn and Charlie Rigoglioso. Both are instrumental members of the scout team and have earned BIG EAST Academic All-Star accolades during their tenures "On the Banks." ### HIGHEST RATED RECRUITING CLASS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Rutgers welcomes the highest-rated class in school history into the fold. The class has been ranked in the top 10 nationally by multiple outlets. All of RU's newcomers enrolled in classes this past summer and competed together in an NCAA sanctioned summer league. The true freshmen class is comprised entirely of players ranked among the top 150 recruits nationally: All-American guard Myles Mack (No. 62 overall by ESPN), guard Jerome Seagears (No. 89 overall by Scout), guard Eli Carter (114 overall by Rivals), wing Malick Kone (No. 145 overall by Hoop Scoop), forward/center Derrick Randall (119 overall by Hoop Scoop) and forward Greg Lewis (127 overall by Hoop Scoop).

### JACK SIDELINED

Rutgers University head men's basketball coach Mike Rice announced on October 10 that redshirt freshman forward Kadeem Jack was having surgery on his right foot to address an injury that occurred during a preseason workout on Oct. 7. Jack is expected to be sidelined approximately three to four months.

"Kadeem has worked extremely hard in preparation for the season," said Rice.

"He will remain very much involved in all team activities and we look forward to his complete recovery."

Under Rice, Rutgers basketball has excelled not only on the hardwood, but also in the classroom. All three 2010-11 seniors – Jonathan Mitchell, James Beatty and Mike Coburn - graduated in May. The Scarlet Knights also had three student-athletes recognized as BIG EAST Academic All Stars, including Gilvydas Biruta, who posted a 3.57 grade point average for the academic year.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Rutgers men's basketball program takes a proactive approach to civic responsibility. ### THE COACHES' KIDS

Four members of the RU coaching staff followed in their father's footsteps – head coach Mike Rice, assistant coach Jimmy Martelli, coordinator of operations/video Corky McMullen and assistant to the head coach Brad Wachtel.

**Rice** – Son of Mike Rice Sr., head coach at Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87). Rice coached for 13 years at the high school level, posting a career record of 245-71, before moving to college coaching in 1977. In four seasons at Duquesne, Rice amassed a 62-49 record, earning two berths in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) and twice being named the Eastern Eight Coach of the Year. At Youngstown State, Rice picked up 75 wins in five years, as the Penguins twice finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference.

**Martelli** – Son of Phil Martelli, the current head coach of Saint Joseph's in Philadelphia. Martelli is in his 17th season with the Hawks, coming into the year with a 300-209 record, including 17 postseason wins. Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories six times in 16 seasons and was the 2004 Consensus National Coach of the Year.

**McMullen** – Son of Tim McMullen, the current head coach of Letchworth High School in western New York. McMullen – who began coaching in 1983 – has won over 300 games with the Indians. McMullen led the squad to its only sectional championship in 1999, with Corky on the squad, and the school's lone Livingston County Division II championship in 2007.

**Wachtel** – Son of Artie Wachtel, former assistant coach at Long Island University and head coach of Perth Amboy Tech. Wachtel spent 18 years with the Blackbirds, working with head coach Paul Lizzo from 1976-1994. In 1995,

Mike Rice enters his second season "On the Banks" in 2011-12 on the heels of an intriguing 2010-11 campaign and with the highest-rated recruiting class in school history in tow. The 17th head coach in the history of the Rutgers men's basketball program, the Pittsburgh, Pa. native has made a definite impact on Garden State hoops and will continue to push the Scarlet Knights to greater heights with a relentless style that has become his trademark.

Rice balances an indomitable courtside manner with an approachable, self-deprecating persona off the court. The resulting dynamic

has paid early dividends for an RU fan base hungry for postseason returns. With just eight scholarship players on the roster last season, the Scarlet Knights earned many notable victories. Off the court, enthusiasm for the program is tangible with a top 10 ranked recruiting class poised to call Piscataway home for the next four years.

Rice wasted little time making his mark in 2010-11. The Scarlet Knights' 9-2 beginning marked the best start for a first-year head coach at RU since Donald S. White began his tenure with a 10-2 record in 1945-46. Included were wins over ACC foe Miami and SEC-member Auburn. An overtime victory against the Pirates at Madison Square Garden marked RU's first BIG EAST tournament win since 2006.

Rice was named the Rutgers' 2010-11 Coach of the Year by the University's student newspaper, the Daily Targum.

Jonathan Mitchell and Gilydas Biruta earned accolades both on and off the court under Rice. Mitchell was an All-Metropolitan selection and was joined by fellow senior tri-captains James Beatty and Mike Coburn in their caps and gowns, as all three earned diplomas in May. Biruta was a BIG EAST All-Rookie honoree and capped his freshman campaign with a 3.57 cumulative grade point average.

the NABC District Coach of the Year, as well as NEC Jim Phelan Coach of the Year, in both 2008 and 2009. A total of 17 school records were either tied or broken under Rice's watch, including victories (26 in 2007-08), NEC wins (16 in 2007-08) and consecutive victories (14 in 2007-08). RMU also posted 15-straight NEC road wins over the course of the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons, a conference record.

In 2009-10, Rice directed Robert Morris to a 23-12 (15-3 NEC) record. The Colonials' season came to a close in a hard-fought, 73-70, overtime loss to No. 2-seeded Villanova in an NCAA opening round contest in Providence, R.I. In 2008-09, RMU posted a 24-11 (15-3 NEC) mark and lost 77-62 to No. 2-seeded and eventual national finalist Michigan State in Minneapolis, Minn. In 2007-08, the Colonials had a 26-8 (16-2 NEC) record and concluded its campaign with an 87-81 NIT loss to No. 1-seeded Syracuse at the Carrier Dome.

Prior to assuming the reins at RMU, Rice served as an assistant and primary recruiter at the University of Pittsburgh under head coach Jamie Dixon in 2006-07. He helped the Panthers to a second-place regular season finish and a spot in the BIG EAST Championship final before the team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Pitt finished with an overall record of 29-8 and Rice was instrumental in attracting a 2007-08 recruiting class that was ranked 16th by Scouts, Inc. and 12th by Hoop Scoop.

From 2004 to 2006, Rice was an assistant under head coach Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia, Pa. He helped the Hawks to a combined record of 43-26 (623) and a pair of NIT bids. In 2004-05, Saint Joseph's finished with a 24-12 record and advanced to the NIT final.

Rice began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater following his graduation, before serving as an assistant coach at Marquette (1994-97), Niagara (1997-98) and Chicago State (1998-2001). At Marquette, Rice was instrumental in helping the Golden Eagles to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in 1996 and 1997. Marquette claimed the 1997 Conference USA Tournament championship and finished as the NIT runner-up in 1995.

A 1991 graduate of Fordham with a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications, Rice was a three-year starter for the Rams at guard. He appeared in 117 career games, serving as captain of the 1990-91 squad that posted 25-8 record and earned an NIT berth. Rice's 152 assists during his senior campaign rank as the sixth highest single-season output in school history.

Rice and his wife Kerry are the proud parents of two children, son Michael (13) and daughter Katie (11). From an athletic family, Rice's mother, Kathy, played basketball at Duquesne, while his sisters, Susan and Stephanie, both played tennis at Syracuse. His father, Mike Rice Sr., served as head men's basketball coach at both Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87) and currently works as the television color commentator for the NBA's Portland Trailblazers.

### Game Notables:

- The 27 assists dished out by Rutgers marked the most since Dec. 7, 1992 (32) in a 132-83 win over Keene State at the RAC. The RU record for most assists in a game came against Boston College (W, 102-92) on Jan. 15, 1977 (33).
- This was the biggest margin of victory (38 points) for RU over a Division I team since Dec. 7, 2005 when RU downed Maryland Eastern Shore 92-50.
- This marks the second game this season RU has scored 90-plus points. The last time the Scarlet Knights tallied two games with more than 90 points was 2005-06 when RU notched four games with 90-plus.
- The Scarlet Knights assisted on 15 of its 17 baskets in the first half, including the first 14 buckets.
- The last time RU dished out 15-plus assists in a half was Dec. 12, 2005 against St. Thomas Aquinas (17). Against a Division I opponent, it marks the first time Rutgers has tallied 15 helpers since March 10, 2005 against Syracuse.
- Rutgers last led by 22 points at half against Norfolk State (44-22) last season on Nov. 23. This is the second opponent RU has held to under 24 points in the first half this year. In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights held opponents under 24 points in the first stanza five times.
- Myles Mack tallied the third double-figure game of his career and his first 20-plus showing with a career high 20 points. The freshman passed his personal best in the first half with 15 points and doubled his previous career high (10).
- Eli Carter registered double-digits for the fourth time this season with 12 points.
- For the seventh time in his career, Mike Poole scored 10-plus with 13 points.
- Gilvydas Biruta scored 13 points, the 24th time in his career the sophomore has gone for double-figures.
- Jerome Seagears led the team with 10 rebounds, his first double-digit rebounding effort. The guard also tallied a personal-best five assists.
- RU moves to 2-1 when four or more players notch 10-plus points.
- Rutgers moves to 4-0 all-time against UMBC and 26-7 against current members of the America East Conference. The Scarlet Knights improve to 5-2 all-time on Nov. 28.
- Greg Lewis scored his first basket in a RU uniform, finishing with four points and his first dunk.
