No. 10/11 Rutgers opens BIG EAST, hosts Syracuse at the RAC

No. 11 Rutgers returns home to begin conference action when it hosts Syracuse on Tuesday, Jan. 3, at the RAC. The Scarlet Knights will open BIG EAST play at home for the third-straight season when they take on the Orange. The game will be broadcast live on CBS College Sports with Brent Stover and Debbie Antonelli calling the action. The contest can also be heard on WCTC 1450 AM with Ed Cohen and Mark Peterson and Rutgers student radio WRSU 88.7 FM.

LAST TIME

No. 11 Rutgers women's basketball (11-2) defeated George Washington (6-7) 75-54 on Friday, Dec. 30 as four Scarlet Knights scored in double-figures led by a game-high 23 points from junior center Monique Oliver.

With the victory over George Washington, the Rutgers women's basketball program earned its 800th victory.

Oliver also added eight rebounds, while senior guard April Sykes scored 17 points, followed by senior guard Khadijah Rushdan with 13 and junior guard Erica Wheeler with 11 points. Rushdan was one rebound shy of a double-double with a game-high nine boards. She also chipped in six assists.

Rushdan became the second player in Rutgers history to post over 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists with a first-half assist on a made basket from Sykes at the 14:52 mark.

Rutgers forced 23 GW turnovers, leading to 28 points off those miscues. The Scarlet Knights also dominated in the paint, outscoring the Colonials 36-10.

The Scarlet Knights scored the opening basket on a layup from Oliver. The score went back and forth with three ties in the first three minutes, as George Washington eventually took its only lead of the game – a one-point advantage (8-7) at the 15:37 mark.

RUTGERS QUICK HITS

• RU is ranked 10th in the AP poll, its first appearance in the top-10 since Nov. 17, 2008 when it was rated third nationally.

• With the victory over George Washington, the Rutgers women's basketball program earned its 800th victory.

• Khadijah Rushdan became the second player in Rutgers history to post over 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists with a first-half assist against GW.

• The 8-0 start for RU was the best since the 2005-06 season. It marked the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer.

• Rutgers held Tennessee – who scored 50 of their 84 points in the paint against DePaul – to 18 points in the paint. On average the Scarlet Knights are allowing 16 points in the paint per game

• The 92 points scored by Miami marked the first time since Jan. 2, 2003 (Texas Tech, 94) that a Rutgers opponent scored 90-plus points in a game. RU entered the contest, holding opponents to 50.9 points per game.

• Rutgers played its first overtime game – including double-overtime – since March 7, 2010 when the Scarlet Knights defeated Georgetown 63-56 (2OT) in the BIG EAST Tournament.

• Senior guard April Sykes moved into eighth place on the all-time list for career three-point field goals made with 113. Sykes also took sole possession of seventh place in career three point field goal attempts with 374.

• Monique Oliver has a team-high three double-doubles this season. She is joined by April Sykes (two) and Betnijah Laney as the only other players with a double-double performance this season. Laney became the first freshman to post a double-double since the 2008-09 season.

• Rutgers' 46 first-half points vs. Temple were the most scored by RU in a half this season and the most in a half since tallying 57 in the opening half against Kean on Dec. 15, 2010. Rutgers finished the period shooting .655 (19-29) from the floor, its highest percentage in a half since its shot .667 (16-24) in the second half against Central Connecticut on Dec. 5, 2010.

• The Scarlet Knights shot their highest percentage of the season against the Owls .549 (28-51). The last time RU shot better than that from the floor was against Seton Hall on Feb. 18, 2009 when they went 30-48 for a .625 clip

• Freshman Betnijah Laney made the first start of her collegiate career, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that a true freshman started the first game of the season, when Myia McCurdy started in the season-opener against Georgia. She had 18 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Usha Gilmore had 20 points vs. Penn State on Nov. 24, 1996.

• Monique Oliver ranks second in the BIG EAST in blocked shots (2.1) and fifth in rebounding (8.5). She is also 10th in the conference field goal percentage (.542).

RU would regain the lead with a jumper from Sykes at 14:52 (9-8) and never looked back. The Scarlet Knights got out to a 19-point edge at the half as Rushdan led all scorers with 13 points, while Sykes added 12.

Despite a couple runs from George Washington, RU was still able to hold onto its double-digit lead, pulling ahead by as much as 26 points with 10:20 left to play.

SCOUTING RUTGERS

The Scarlet Knights earned a 75-54 road victory at George Washington to extend their win streak to two games. Junior center Monique Oliver led RU with a game-high 23 points as four players scored in double figures.

Rutgers is led by three double-figure scorers with April Sykes pacing the squad with 14.9 points per game, followed by Khadijah Rushdan (12.4 ppg) and Monique Oliver (12.2 ppg).

Oliver leads the Scarlet Knights on the boards with 8.5 rebounds per game, while Rushdan is averaging a team-best 3.3 assists per outing. Oliver ranks second in the BIG EAST with 2.1 blocks per game and fifth in rebounding.

Defense is a staple for Rutgers which is limiting opponents to 53.6 points per game. RU is ranked 10th nationally in field percentage defense (.314) and 38th in scoring defense (53.6).

SCOUTING SYRACUSE

Syracuse is 11-4 on the season and winners of three-straight. The Orange are led by four players in double-figures as Kayla Alexander is averaging a team-best 15.9 points per game. Iasia Hemingway is second on the team with 15.7 points per contest, followed by Carmen Tyson-Thomas and Elashier Hall. Tyson-Thomas has a 12.5 average while Hall is adding 10.2 points per game.

Tyson-Thomas is the leading rebounder for the Orange, averaging 8.3 boards per game, followed by Alexander with 7.8 rebounds per contest. Hemingway and Shakeya Leary are also posting 7.0 rebounds per outing. The Orange are ranked sixth in the nation in rebounding margin and first in the conference.

ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST SYRACUSE

Rutgers and Syracuse will meet for the 38th time with the Scarlet Knights holding a 31-6 advantage in the all-time series, including a 19-5 mark in BIG EAST games. RU won the previous two matchups against the Orange. Both squads faced off in a BIG EAST opener on Jan. 13, 2010 as SU defeated the Scarlet Knights 79-66.

RUTGERS IN BIG EAST OPENERS

Rutgers is 11-5 all-time in BIG EAST openers and 9-1 when the first conference game of the season is played at the RAC. The Scarlet Knights have won six of their last eight BIG EAST openers, including two-straight. RU upset No. 11/12

The Scarlet Knights are 184-79 (.699) all-time in BIG EAST regular season games. Rutgers is 80-52 (.606) all-time in BIG EAST regular season road games. Conversely, the Scarlet Knights are 104-27 (.794) in conference home games.

RUTGERS VS. THE TOP-10

Rutgers is 0-2 against AP top-10 teams this season, most recently dropping a 67-61 contest against No. 6/6 Tennessee. The Scarlet Knights also suffered a 92-81 loss in double overtime at Miami.

SCARLET KNIGHTS IN THE NATIONAL POLL

Rutgers made its return to the national rankings this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 pre-season AP poll at No. 25.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is currently fourth on the all-time list of AP appearances with 396.

The Scarlet Knights are ranked 10th the AP and 11th in the ESPN/USA Today polls. RU is ranked in the top-10 for the first time since Nov. 17, 2008.

DEFENSE IS THE HALLMARK FOR WINNING

Entering the contest against Florida, the Gators were averaging 73.0 points through seven games. RU held the UF to 49 points - their lowest point total of the season at that point. Three of Florida's four double-digit scorers were held to single figure scoring totals, including leading scorer Jennifer George (13.4 ppg) who scored four points.

Rutgers' defense is ranked 10th in field goal percentage defense (.318) and 38th in scoring defense (53.6 points per game).

STARTING THE SEASON OFF STRONG

Rutgers opened the 2011-12 campaign on an 8-0 streak - its best start since the 2005-06 campaign. This marks the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. (2005-06; 8-0), (1990-91; 13-0), (1986-87; 23-0) and (1983-84; 8-0).

RUTGERS TAKES THE EARLY LEAD

The Scarlet Knights have jumped out to an early lead, scoring the opening basket in nine games this season. Rutgers has also led wire-to-wire in five wins this year. RU has held double-digit leads in 11 games this season.

FILLING UP THE STAT SHEET

Rutgers has six double-double performances on the season, coming from three different Scarlet Knights. Monique Oliver has a team-high three double-doubles, including a season high 23 points and 19 rebounds against No. 9 Miami. She entered the season with two for her career. April Sykes is second with two double-doubles, most recently with 19 points and 10 boards. Bentnijah Laney has one double-double this season - the first of her career - to become the first freshman to achieve the mark in their rookie season since 2008.

RUSHDAN TOPS 1,000-POINT MARK

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan became the 30th player in Rutgers women's basketball history to score 1,000 points for her career. She entered the game against No. 9 Miami needing

seven points to crack the plateau and posted 10 versus the Hurricanes.

Rushdan also became just the second player in program history to record 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists, joining former All-American Cappie Pondexter (2002-06).

OLIVER HOSTING BLOCK PARTY

Junior center Monique Oliver moved into the Rutgers record books for all-time blocked shots this season. She claimed sole possession of eighth place with 113 career blocks, surpassing Sandy Tupurins (1976-80) and Essence Carson (2004-08). Oliver is tied for second in the BIG EAST averaging 2.1 blocks per game and ranks 45th nationally.

SYKES FROM BEHIND THE ARC

Senior April Sykes continues to climb the Rutgers record books as one of the top three-point shooters in school history. Sykes entered the top-10 list for career three point field goals made (eighth, 119) and three point field goals attempted (fifth, 393).

NCAA TOURNAMENT CALIBER COMPETITION

Rutgers will face 13 teams in 2011-12 that advanced to the NCAA Tournament field of 64 last season. Among the group are five Sweet 16 squads and two Final Four contenders, including Notre Dame which competed for the National Championship.

Georgia Tech, Arizona State, Temple, Miami, Tennessee, Louisville, St. John's, DePaul, Georgetown, Connecticut, West Virginia and Marquette round out the remaining 12 teams on the schedule for the Scarlet Knights.

BIENVENIDOS SAN JUAN

Rutgers took its four-game win streak to San Juan, Puerto Rico and added two to the win col-

umn with victories over Georgia Tech (RV/25) and Arizona State at the San Juan Shootout.

Senior guard April Sykes was named the San Juan Shootout MVP following a 16-point and 10-rebound double-double against Georgia Tech. She followed that with a 14-point, five-rebound effort against Arizona State.

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan was selected to the All-Tournament team, averaging 10.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

LEE OUT FOR SEASON WITH INJURY

Chelsey Lee will miss the 2011-12 season following shoulder surgery. The 6-2 forward has one year of eligibility remaining and will compete for the Scarlet Knights in 2012-13.

Lee was dominant in the paint for the Scarlet Knights last season, leading the squad in rebounding with 7.5 per game. She also contributed on the offensive end with 8.5 points per game, including 16 double-figure scoring games.

Lee grabbed seven or more boards in 22 games had six double-digit rebounding games and was the team's leading rebounder in 19 contests. She recorded a team-best five double-doubles. Lee has been the Scarlet Knights' leading rebounder in each of the past two seasons and averages 5.6 per game for her career.

FAB FIVE MAKE DEBUT AS SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers once again assembled a nationally-ranked recruiting class with this season's freshmen rated the third-best group in the country.

The five-member class - Shakena Richardson, Briyona Canty, Betnijah Laney, Christa Evans and Syessence Davis - features four players ranked in the ESPNU HoopGuriz 100, including two rated in the top-10.

In the season-opener against Cal, each of the five made their collegiate debuts, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that five freshman appeared in the season-opener - when DelaQuese Jernigan, Epiphanny Prince, Myia McCurdy, Brittany Ray and Rashidat Junaid made

C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 17th Season at Rutgers, 41th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, including her enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering her 41st season on the sidelines, Stringer was the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever

NCAA National Championship game.

The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 863-308 (.737), which ranks third on the Division I women's victories list and second among active coaches. In 2008, Stringer became just the eighth coach - men's or women's - to reach the 800-win mark and her 31 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania, "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball, but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

SUCCESS COMES QUICKLY TO "THE BANKS"

Stringer arrived at Rutgers in July of 1995 armed with a belief in the program's ability, calling it the "Jewel of the East" upon her hiring. After two years of gathering materials and going over blueprints, Stringer saw her plans begin to come together in 1998 when her team - filled with nine freshmen and sophomores - posted its first 20-win season in four years (22-10), winning the BIG EAST 7 Division title with a 14-4 regular-season record.

Following their first-ever BIG EAST crown, the Scarlet Knights gave a hint of what was to come when then-freshman Tasha Pointer made two late free throws to lift RU to a 62-61 win at Iowa State and advance to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

As if mapped out in her master plan, Rutgers continued its steady progression the next season. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out to the eventual national champion for the second-

consecutive year. They compiled a 29-6 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play to share the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Tabbed as the number-one team in the nation in the Street & Smith's 2000 Preseason Poll, Rutgers lived up to its billing as one of the top programs in the country, finishing the season with a 26-8 record, a 12-4 slate in the BIG EAST and a spot in its second BIG EAST Tournament championship game in three years. With their 59-51 upset of top-seeded Georgia in the NCAA Tournament West Region final, the Scarlet Knights advanced to their first-ever Final Four. For Stringer, who had declared her revelation five years earlier of leading Rutgers to the 2000 Final Four in nearby Philadelphia, there was a sense of triumph in fulfilling her dreams of making Rutgers a national contender.

The 2006-07 team was a young squad with no seniors and five freshmen. Stringer held fast on the group, teaching, shaping and leading the unit to the grandest stage, the Final Four and Rutgers' first appearance in a national championship game where it faced Tennessee.

In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights earned their ninth-straight NCAA Tournament berth, advancing to a second round matchup with eventual National Champion Texas A&M. The second round showing was the 11th under Stringer – in 16 years at RU – who also picked up her 31st 20-win season (second-most all-time).

From the first NCAA Championship game in 1982 to consistently putting together a team vying for the national crown, Stringer has helped to redefine the women's game.

WE ARE A FAMILY

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgers-based charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers — they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.
