### No. 11/8 Rutgers Faces Ranked Foes, Hosts No. 23/19 DePaul

No. 11/8 Rutgers will face its first of four-consecutive nationally-ranked opponents when it hosts No. 23/19 DePaul on Tuesday, Jan. 24 at the RAC at 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast live on CBS Sports Network with Brent Stover and Debbie Antonelli calling the action. The contest can also be heard live on the Rutgers Radio Network WCTC 1450 AM and Rutgers student radio WRSU 88.7 FM.

#### LAST TIME

Rutgers senior guard April Sykes had a game-high 23 points and 10 rebounds as the No. 7/8 Scarlet Knights defeated USF 72-66 on Saturday, Jan. 21.

Sykes recorded her team-leading fourth double-double of the season and fifth of her career. It was also her second 20-point game of the season. Sykes was joined in double-figures by senior guard Khadijah Rushdan with 16 points and junior center Monique Oliver with 14. The pair also added seven rebounds apiece.

USF opened the game outscoring RU 11-3, including three-straight three pointers to start the contest. Rutgers responded going 12-4 over the next seven minutes to tie the game at 15-15. The score remained close throughout the first half with the Scarlet Knights taking a

two-point lead into halftime, 29-27.

Sykes took over in the second half, scoring the first seven points to help RU build a five-point lead (36-31). Sykes shot 8-for-11 from the floor, including 2-for-2 from behind the arc for 19 second-half points.

The Scarlet Knights led by as much as 13 points (58-45) with 6:44 left to play.

#### SCOUTING RUTGERS

The Scarlet Knights (16-3, 5-1 BIG EAST) bounced back from its first conference loss of the season with a 72-66 victory against USF on Saturday night. April Sykes (Starkville, Miss.) recorded her fourth double-double of the season, tallying 23 points – 19 coming in the second

**RUTGERS QUICK HITS**

- RU is ranked 11th in the AP Top 25 and eighth in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.
- With the victory over George Washington, the Rutgers women's basketball program earned its 800th victory.
- Khadijah Rushdan became the second player in Rutgers history to post over 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists with a first-half assist against GW.
- April Sykes scored the game's opening basket against St. John's to become the 31st player in school history to top 1,000 career points. She is the second to achieve the feat this season, joining fellow senior Khadijah Rushdan who hit the mark against Miami.
- Monique Oliver ranks third in the BIG EAST in blocked shots (1.8) and sixth in rebounding (7.9). She is also eighth in the conference field goal percentage (.565) and 10th nationally.
- The 15-2 start this season was the best opening since the 2007-08 campaign. The 8-0 start for RU was the best since the 2005-06 season.
- Rutgers held Tennessee - who scored 50 of their 84 points in the paint against DePaul - to 18 points in the paint. On average the Scarlet Knights are allowing 19.6 points in the paint per game, while averaging 34.0 points in the paint.
- Defense is a hallmark of the Rutgers program and this year's team is continuing that tradition. The Scarlet Knights are ranked ninth in the nation in field goal percentage defense and 29th in scoring defense.
- Rutgers is holding opponents to their lowest field goal percentage (.333) since the 2007-08 season.
- The 21 assists against USF were the most in a game for the Scarlet Knights since Nov. 22, 2010 when RU had 22 against North Carolina A&T.
- Rutgers has played two overtime games this season, going 1-1 in those contests. RU loss to No. 9 Miami in double overtime and defeated Louisville in overtime. It is the most OT games in a season since 2008-09 when RU played three.
- Monique Oliver and April Sykes have a team-high four double-doubles this season. Betnijah Laney is the only other player with a double-double performance this season. Laney became the first freshman to post a double-double since the 2008-09 season.
- The Scarlet Knights shot their highest percentage of the season against the Owls .549 (28-51). The last time RU shot better than that from the floor was against Seton Hall on Feb. 18, 2009 when they went 30-48 for a .625 clip.
- Freshman Betnijah Laney made the first start of her collegiate career, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that a true freshman started the first game of the season, when Myia McCurdy started in the season-opener against Georgia. She had 18 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Usha Gilmore had 20 points vs. Penn State on Nov. 24, 1996.
- Betnijah Laney also has the most starts in a season for a true freshman since 2006-07.

half - and 10 rebounds. Senior Khadijah Rushdan (Wilmington, Del.) added 16 points, while junior Monique Oliver (Las Vegas, Nev.) chipped in 14.

RU is led offensively by a pair of 1,000 point scorers in Sykes (14.6 ppg.) and Rushdan (12.5 ppg.). The two are averaging over five rebounds apiece per game, while Rushdan is chipping in 3.6 assists.

Oliver continues to be a force down-low for the Scarlet Knights, shooting a team-leading .565 clip from the floor and averaging 12.3 points, and 7.9 boards per contest.

Rutgers' stingy defense - which is limiting teams' to 53.8 points per game and a .333 clip from the field - will look to hold off DePaul's offense which is posting 74.7 points per game this season - third in the conference - and is connecting on 8.6 three point field goals a game.

**SCOUTING DEPAUL**

DePaul (15-5, 3-3 BIG EAST) has dropped three of its last four contests, including an 88-44 loss to No. 3 Connecticut on Saturday night. Brittany Hrynko led the Blue Demons with 18 points, shooting 4-5 from beyond the arc and .500 clip from the floor.

Anna Martin, the only player to start all 20 games for the Blue Demons this season and last week's BIG EAST Player of the Week, paces the squad with 18.3 points per game. Keisha Hampton and Hrynko are adding 16.6 and 11.0 points per game.

**ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST DEPAUL**

The Scarlet Knights hold a 4-3 all-time advantage over DePaul. Both teams split the previous two meetings, with the Blue Demons winning the most recent matchup, 66-62 on Feb. 15, 2011 at DePaul. RU is a perfect 3-0 at the RAC.

**RUTGERS IN ALL-TIME BIG EAST GAMES**

The Scarlet Knights are 189-80 (.699) all-time in BIG EAST regular season games. Rutgers is 107-27 (.794) in conference home games. The Scarlet Knights are 82-53 (.606) all-time in BIG EAST regular season road games.

**SCARLET KNIGHTS AVENGE 2010-11 LOSSES**

Rutgers is 4-2 this season in games against opponents that it suffered a loss to last season. The Scarlet Knights defeated California, Boston College, Temple and Louisville which all earned wins against RU a year ago. The two repeat losses for Rutgers was against Tennessee and St. John's.

**RUTGERS VS. THE AP TOP-25**

Rutgers is 1-2 against AP Top-25 teams this season, most recently defeating No. 16/15 Louisville 71-68 in overtime at the RAC. Rutgers suffered losses against No. 6/6 Tennessee and No. 9/9 Miami.

this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 preseason AP poll at No. 25.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is currently third on the all-time list of AP appearances with 400.

The Scarlet Knights are ranked 11th in the AP and eighth in the ESPN/USA Today polls.

**RUTGERS REBOUNDS FROM LOSSES**

The Scarlet Knights have rebounded from each of their three losses this season. RU is 3-0 in the game following a loss.

**DEFENSE IS THE HALLMARK FOR WINNING**

Entering the contest against Florida, the Gators were averaging 73.0 points through seven games. RU held the UF to 49 points - their lowest point total of the season at that point. Three of Florida's four double-digit scorers were held to single figure scoring totals, including leading scorer Jennifer George (13.4 ppg) who scored four points.

The Scarlet Knights recently held Syracuse nearly 30 points below its scoring average. The Orange entered the game averaging 72.0 points per game, which RU limited them to 44 points - a difference of 28 points.

RU has held 10 opponents to 50 points or less, including limiting a pair of teams to 52 and 54 points, respectively. The Scarlet Knights are holding teams to 52.6 points per contest.

Rutgers' defense is ranked ninth in field goal percentage defense (.333) and 29th in scoring defense (53.8 points per game).

**STARTING THE SEASON OFF STRONG**

Rutgers opened the 2011-12 campaign on an 8-0 streak - its best start since the 2005-06 campaign. This marks the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. (2005-06; 8-0), (1990-91; 13-0), (1986-87; 23-0) and (1983-84; 8-0). RU went 15-2 to start the year for the first time since the 2007-08 season.

**GETTING THE STARTING NOD**

The Scarlet Knights have used eight different starting lineups this season. Each of Rutgers' five freshmen have earned a start with Betnijah Laney leading the way with six starts.

**FILLING UP THE STAT SHEET**

Rutgers has nine double-double performances on the season, coming from three different Scarlet Knights. Monique Oliver and April Sykes are tied with a team-leading four double-doubles. Oliver most recently posted 10 points and 11 rebounds at Pittsburgh, while Sykes is coming off a 23-point, 10-rebound effort vs. USF. Betnijah Laney has one double-double this season - the first of her career - to become the first freshman to achieve the mark in their rookie season since 2008.

**RUSHDAN TOPS 1,000-POINT MARK**

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan became the 30th player in Rutgers women's basketball history to score 1,000 points for her career. She entered the game against No. 9 Miami needing seven points to crack the plateau and posted 10 versus the Hurricanes.

Rushdan also became just the second player in program history to record 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists, joining former All-American Cappie Pondexter (2002-06).

**SYKES JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB**

Senior guard April Sykes became the 31st player in Rutgers women's basketball history to score 1,000 points after scoring the opening basket against St. John's.

**OLIVER HOSTING BLOCK PARTY**

Junior center Monique Oliver moved into the Rutgers record books for all-time blocked shots this season. She claimed sole possession of eighth place with 121 career blocks.

**SYKES FROM BEHIND THE ARC**

Senior April Sykes continues to climb the Rutgers record books as one of the top three-point shooters in school history. Sykes entered the top-10 list for career three point field goals made (seventh, 128) and three point field goals attempted (fourth, 417).

**REGULARS AT THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

Rutgers is one of only 10 teams in NCAA Division I to have qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last nine seasons, joining Connecticut, DePaul, Duke, Georgia, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT CALIBER COMPETITION**

Rutgers will face 13 teams in 2011-12 that advanced to the NCAA Tournament field of 64 last season. Among the group are five Sweet 16 squads and two Final Four contenders, including Notre Dame which competed for the National Championship.

**BIENVENIDOS SAN JUAN**

Rutgers took its four-game win streak to San Juan, Puerto Rico and added two to the win column with victories over Georgia Tech (RV/25) and Arizona State at the San Juan Shootout.

Senior guard April Sykes was named the San Juan Shootout MVP following a 16-point and 10-rebound double-double against Georgia Tech. She followed that with a 14-point, five-rebound effort against Arizona State.

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan was selected to the All-Tournament team, averaging 10.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

**LEE OUT FOR SEASON WITH INJURY**

Chelsey Lee will miss the 2011-12 season following shoulder surgery. The 6-2 forward has one year of eligibility remaining and will compete for the Scarlet Knights in 2012-13.

Lee was dominant in the paint for the Scarlet Knights last season, leading the squad in rebounding with 7.5 per game. She also contributed on the offensive end with 8.5 points per game, including 16 double-figure scoring games.

Lee grabbed seven or more boards in 22 games had six double-digit rebounding games and was the team's leading rebounder in 19 contests. She recorded a team-best five double-doubles. Lee has been the Scarlet Knights' leading rebounder in each of the past two seasons and averages 5.6 per game for her career.

**FAB FIVE MAKE DEBUT AS SCARLET KNIGHTS**

Rutgers once again assembled a nationally-ranked recruiting class with this season's freshmen rated the third-best group in the country.

The five-member class - Shakena Richardson, Briyona Canty, Betnijah Laney, Christa Evans and Syessence Davis - features four players ranked in the ESPNU HoopGurlz 100, including two rated in the top-10.

In the season-opener against Cal, each of the five made their collegiate debuts, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that five freshman appeared in the season-opener - when DelaQuese Jernigan, Epiphanny Prince, Myia McCurdy, Brittany Ray and Rashidat Junaid made their debuts.

**850 WINS AND COUNTING**

Rutgers head coach C. Vivian Stringer collected her 850th career victory with a win over Kean on Dec. 15, 2010. Stringer became just the third women's coach to reach that plateau, joining Tennessee head coach Pat Summit and former Texas mentor Jody Conradt.

**2011-12 SCHEDULE POSED TOUGH TEST**

A hallmark of Rutgers basketball is its competitive schedule and this year's slate features that same philosophy. The Scarlet Knights will face 18 of 29 regular-season opponents that advanced to some form of postseason play last season.

# C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 17th Season at Rutgers, 41th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, including her enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering her 41st season on the sidelines, Stringer was the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever

NCAA National Championship game.

The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 863-308 (.737), which ranks third on the Division I women's victories list and second among active coaches. In 2008, Stringer became just the eighth coach - men's or women's - to reach the 800-win mark and her 31 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania, "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball, but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

## SUCCESS COMES QUICKLY TO "THE BANKS"

Stringer arrived at Rutgers in July of 1995 armed with a belief in the program's ability, calling it the "Jewel of the East" upon her hiring. After two years of gathering materials and going over blueprints, Stringer saw her plans begin to come together in 1998 when her team - filled with nine freshmen and sophomores - posted its first 20-win season in four years (22-10), winning the BIG EAST 7 Division title with a 14-4 regular-season record.

Following their first-ever BIG EAST crown, the Scarlet Knights gave a hint of what was to come when then-freshman Tasha Pointer made two late free throws to lift RU to a 62-61 win at Iowa State and advance to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

As if mapped out in her master plan, Rutgers continued its steady progression the next season. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out to the eventual national champion for the second-

consecutive year. They compiled a 29-6 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play to share the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Tabbed as the number-one team in the nation in the Street & Smith's 2000 Preseason Poll, Rutgers lived up to its billing as one of the top programs in the country, finishing the season with a 26-8 record, a 12-4 slate in the BIG EAST and a spot in its second BIG EAST Tournament championship game in three years. With their 59-51 upset of top-seeded Georgia in the NCAA Tournament West Region final, the Scarlet Knights advanced to their first-ever Final Four. For Stringer, who had declared her revelation five years earlier of leading Rutgers to the 2000 Final Four in nearby Philadelphia, there was a sense of triumph in fulfilling her dreams of making Rutgers a national contender.

The 2006-07 team was a young squad with no seniors and five freshmen. Stringer held fast on the group, teaching, shaping and leading the unit to the grandest stage, the Final Four and Rutgers' first appearance in a national championship game where it faced Tennessee.

In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights earned their ninth-straight NCAA Tournament berth, advancing to a second round matchup with eventual National Champion Texas A&M. The second round showing was the 11th under Stringer – in 16 years at RU – who also picked up her 31st 20-win season (second-most all-time).

From the first NCAA Championship game in 1982 to consistently putting together a team vying for the national crown, Stringer has helped to redefine the women's game.

**WE ARE A FAMILY**

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgers-based charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers — they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.
