No. 11/12 Rutgers Travels To D.C., Takes On No. 20/18 Georgetown

No. 11/12 Rutgers will face its second of four-consecutive nationally-ranked opponents when travels to No. 20/18 Georgetown on Sunday, Jan. 29. Tip-off at McDonough Arena is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. and the contest will be broadcast live on ESPNU with Anne Marie Anderson and Christy Winters calling the action. The game can also be heard live on the Rutgers Radio Network WCTC 1450 AM and Rutgers student radio WRSU 88.7 FM.

LAST TIME

Rutgers senior guard Khadijah Rushdan scored 24 points and the game-winning layup with 1.5 seconds left on the clock as the No. 11/12 Scarlet Knights erased a 16-point second-half deficit to defeat No. 23/22 DePaul 65-64 on Tuesday night at the RAC.

In addition to Rushdan scoring in double-figures, junior guard Erica Wheeler and junior center Monique Oliver each added 10 points in the contest. Freshman Syessence Davis chipped in a career-high nine points, to go along with five rebounds. Rushdan was one rebound shy of a double-double with nine boards, while adding five assists.

Rutgers overcame its largest deficit of the season en route to its second-straight BIG EAST

victory, due in large part to the late-game effort from Rushdan. In the final 3:40 of the contest, Rushdan singlehandedly outscored DePaul 11-4. Over the past three games, she is averaging 8.7 points per game in the final five minutes of play.

The Scarlet Knights built a five-point lead (28-23) with 4:56 to play in the first half and seemed poised to carry the advantage into the locker room at halftime. However, the Blue Demons went on a 9-4 spurt to close the opening period, hitting a three-pointer to tie the score for the first time in the half at 32-32.

DePaul took a lead for the fifth time on the night, pulling ahead by 14 points (50-36), as the Scarlet Knights struggled to keep the game

RUTGERS QUICK HITS

- RU is ranked 11th in the AP Top 25 and eighth in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.
- With the victory over George Washington, the Rutgers women's basketball program earned its 800th victory.
- Khadijah Rushdan became the second player in Rutgers history to post over 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists with a first-half assist against GW.
- Rutgers posted its 10th home win of the season, marking the 10th-straight year that the Scarlet Knights have won at least 10 home games.
- In the past three games, Khadijah Rushdan is averaging 8.7 points and 2.3 rebounds in the final five minutes of the contest. She is also shooting 83.3 percent (10-for-12) from the field during the span.
- April Sykes scored the game's opening basket against St. John's to become the 31st player in school history to top 1,000 career points. She is the second to achieve the feat this season, joining fellow senior Khadijah Rushdan who hit the mark against Miami.
- Monique Oliver ranks third in the BIG EAST in blocked shots (1.8) and seventh in rebounding (7.8). She is also eight in the conference field goal percentage (.565) and 10th nationally.
- The 15-2 start this season was the best opening since the 2007-08 campaign. The 8-0 start for RU was the best since the 2005-06 season.
- Rutgers held Tennessee - who scored 50 of their 84 points in the paint against DePaul - to 18 points in the paint. On average the Scarlet Knights are allowing 19.6 points in the paint per game, while averaging 34.0 points in the paint.
- Defense is a hallmark of the Rutgers program and this year's team is continuing that tradition. The Scarlet Knights are ranked ninth in the nation in field goal percentage defense and 29th in scoring defense.
- Rutgers is holding opponents to their lowest field goal percentage (.333) since the 2007-08 season.
- Rutgers has played two overtime games this season, going 1-1 in those contests. RU loss to No. 9 Miami in double overtime and defeated Louisville in overtime. It is the most OT games in a season since 2008-09 when RU played three.
- Monique Oliver and April Sykes have a team-high four double-doubles this season. Betnijah Laney is the only other player with a double-double performance this season. Laney became the first freshman to post a double-double since the 2008-09 season.
- Freshman Betnijah Laney made the first start of her collegiate career, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that a true freshman started the first game of the season, when Myia McCurdy started in the season-opener against Georgia. She had 18 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Usha Gilmore had 20 points vs. Penn State on Nov. 24, 1996.
- Betnijah Laney also has the most starts in a season for a true freshman since 2006-07.

close. Rutgers opened the second half shooting 3-for-10 from the field with Rushdan, Sykes and Oliver providing the only field goals to that point.

Rutgers trailed by as much as 16 points (56-40) with 10:26 left in the game, but the tide eventually shifted as the Scarlet Knights began to rally and chip away at the deficit. An emphasis on defense proved to be the difference maker with DePaul committing five turnovers on the final nine possessions, including three missed shots.

Rushdan ignited the RU offense, scoring the final 11 points down the stretch. With DePaul leading by one (64-63), Deanna Ortiz went to the free throw line with a chance to put the Blue Demons ahead by three. Ortiz missed the front end of a one-and-one, and freshman Betnijah Laney grabbed the rebound which was played ahead to Rushdan as the final seconds ticked off the clock. Rushdan dribbled full court past the DePaul defense and sank the game-winner with 1.5 to play.

SCOUTING RUTGERS

Senior Khadijah Rushdan helped dig Rutgers out of its largest deficit of the season, 16 points, with a season-high 24 points, including the game-winner with 1.5 remaining on the clock against DePaul. Rushdan singlehandedly outscored the Blue Demons 11-4 in the final 3:40 to pull-off the win.

Juniors Monique Oliver and Erica Wheeler each added double-digit points against DPU. Oliver has recorded 10-plus points in six-consecutive contests. Freshman Syessence Davis provided a spark off the bench in the opening stanza, pouring in seven of her season-high nine points and four of her season-high five rebounds in the half.

Rushdan is averaging a team-leading 14.4 points and 4.4 assists per game during conference play - tying for 11th in scoring and tied for fifth in assists in the league. Senior April Sykes is first on the team in scoring with 14.4 points per contest this season and is second in rebounding, averaging 5.8 boards. Oliver is adding 12.2 points per game, on .563 percent shooting from the floor and is pulling down a team-leading 7.8 rebounds.

SCOUTING GEORGETOWN

Georgetown sits sixth in the BIG EAST after winning three of its last four, including Tuesday's 64-54 victory at West Virginia. Senior Tia Magee led the Hoyas on a second-half charge against the Mountaineers, tallying all 17 of her points in the final period. Magee recorded four of the team's 12 steals on 30 WVU turnovers. Sugar Rodgers - the league's leading scorer - chipped in 17 points of her own, along with six rebounds, two steals and two assists.

Rodgers - a Preseason All-BIG EAST Team selection - paces GU with 19.9 points and a team-best 2.4 steals per game. Magee follows with 11.4 ppg and a team-high 6.5 rpg.

The Hoyas defense is forcing 23.6 turnovers a game on 11.9 steals and limiting teams to 51.9

RUTGERS VS. THE AP TOP-25

Rutgers is 2-2 against AP Top-25 teams this season, most recently defeating No. 23/22 DePaul. RU also earned a victory over No. 16/15 Louisville. Rutgers suffered losses against No. 6/6 Tennessee and No. 9/9 Miami.

SCARLET KNIGHTS IN THE NATIONAL POLL

Rutgers made its return to the national rankings this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 preseason AP poll at No. 25.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is currently third on the all-time list of AP appearances with 400.

RUTGERS REBOUNDS FROM LOSSES

The Scarlet Knights have rebounded from each of their three losses this season. RU is 3-0 in the game following a loss.

DEFENSE IS THE HALLMARK FOR WINNING

Entering the contest against Florida, the Ga-tors were averaging 73.0 points through seven games. RU held the UF to 49 points - their lowest point total of the season at that point. Three of Florida's four double-digit scorers were held to single figure scoring totals, including leading scorer Jennifer George (13.4 ppg) who scored four points.

The Scarlet Knights recently held Syracuse nearly 30 points below its scoring average. The Orange entered the game averaging 72.0 points per game, which RU limited them to 44 points - a difference of 28 points.

RU has held 10 opponents to 50 points or less, including limiting a pair of teams to 52 and 54 points, respectively. The Scarlet Knights are holding teams to 52.6 points per contest.

Rutgers' defense is ranked ninth in field goal percentage defense (.333) and 29th in scoring defense (53.8 points per game).

STARTING THE SEASON OFF STRONG

Rutgers opened the 2011-12 campaign on an 8-0 streak - its best start since the 2005-06 campaign. This marks the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. (2005-06; 8-0), (1990-91; 13-0), (1986-87; 23-0) and (1983-84; 8-0). RU went 15-2 to start the year for the first time since the 2007-08 season.

GETTING THE STARTING NOD

The Scarlet Knights have used eight different starting lineups this season. Each of Rutgers' five freshmen have earned a start with Betnijah Laney leading the way with seven starts.

SYKES JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Senior guard April Sykes became the 31st player in Rutgers women's basketball history to score 1,000 points after scoring the opening basket against St. John's.

OLIVER HOSTING BLOCK PARTY

Junior center Monique Oliver moved into the Rutgers record books for all-time blocked shots this season. She claimed sole possession of eighth place with 122 career blocks.

SYKES FROM BEHIND THE ARC

Senior April Sykes continues to climb the Rutgers record books as one of the top three-point shooters in school history. Sykes entered the top-10 list for career three point field goals made (seventh, 129) and three point field goals attempted (fourth, 421).

REGULARS AT THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Rutgers is one of only 10 teams in NCAA Division I to have qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last nine seasons, joining Connecticut, DePaul, Duke, Georgia, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee.

NCAA TOURNAMENT CALIBER COMPETITION

Rutgers will face 13 teams in 2011-12 that advanced to the NCAA Tournament field of 64 last season. Among the group are five Sweet 16 squads and two Final Four contenders, including Notre Dame which competed for the National Championship.

Georgia Tech, Arizona State, Temple, Miami, Tennessee, Louisville, St. John's, DePaul, Georgetown, Connecticut, West Virginia and Marquette round out the remaining 12 teams on the schedule for the Scarlet Knights.

The five-member class - Shakena Richardson, Briyona Canty, Betnijah Laney, Christa Evans and Syessence Davis - features four players ranked in the ESPNU HoopGurlz 100, including two rated in the top-10.

In the season-opener against Cal, each of the five made their collegiate debuts, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that five freshman appeared in the season-opener - when DelaQuese Jernigan, Epiphanny Prince, Myia McCurdy, Brittany Ray and Rashidat Junaid made their debuts.

Rutgers head coach C. Vivian Stringer collected her 850th career victory with a win over Kean on Dec. 15, 2010. Stringer became just the third women's coach to reach that plateau, joining Tennessee head coach Pat Summit and former Texas mentor Jody Conradt.

In her sophomore season at New Hope, the 6-4 post helped the Trojans to their first district championship in 18 years, averaging 13.0 points per game for the black and gold. Hollivay, a five-star prospect, was invited to Colorado Springs – on two occasions – for the U16 and U17 National Team Trials. C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 17th Season at Rutgers, 41th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, including her enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering her 41st season on the sidelines, Stringer was the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever

NCAA National Championship game.

The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 863-308 (.737), which ranks third on the Division I women's victories list and second among active coaches. In 2008, Stringer became just the eighth coach - men's or women's - to reach the 800-win mark and her 31 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania, "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball, but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

SUCCESS COMES QUICKLY TO "THE BANKS"

Stringer arrived at Rutgers in July of 1995 armed with a belief in the program's ability, calling it the "Jewel of the East" upon her hiring. After two years of gathering materials and going over blueprints, Stringer saw her plans begin to come together in 1998 when her team - filled with nine freshmen and sophomores - posted its first 20-win season in four years (22-10), winning the BIG EAST 7 Division title with a 14-4 regular-season record.

Following their first-ever BIG EAST crown, the Scarlet Knights gave a hint of what was to come when then-freshman Tasha Pointer made two late free throws to lift RU to a 62-61 win at Iowa State and advance to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

As if mapped out in her master plan, Rutgers continued its steady progression the next season. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out to the eventual national champion for the second-

consecutive year. They compiled a 29-6 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play to share the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Tabbed as the number-one team in the nation in the Street & Smith's 2000 Preseason Poll, Rutgers lived up to its billing as one of the top programs in the country, finishing the season with a 26-8 record, a 12-4 slate in the BIG EAST and a spot in its second BIG EAST Tournament championship game in three years. With their 59-51 upset of top-seeded Georgia in the NCAA Tournament West Region final, the Scarlet Knights advanced to their first-ever Final Four. For Stringer, who had declared her revelation five years earlier of leading Rutgers to the 2000 Final Four in nearby Philadelphia, there was a sense of triumph in fulfilling her dreams of making Rutgers a national contender.

The 2006-07 team was a young squad with no seniors and five freshmen. Stringer held fast on the group, teaching, shaping and leading the unit to the grandest stage, the Final Four and Rutgers' first appearance in a national championship game where it faced Tennessee.

In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights earned their ninth-straight NCAA Tournament berth, advancing to a second round matchup with eventual National Champion Texas A&M. The second round showing was the 11th under Stringer – in 16 years at RU – who also picked up her 31st 20-win season (second-most all-time).

From the first NCAA Championship game in 1982 to consistently putting together a team vying for the national crown, Stringer has helped to redefine the women's game.

WE ARE A FAMILY

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgers-based charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers — they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.
