No. 15/15 Rutgers Hits Road To Face La Salle Saturday Night

No. 15/15 Rutgers will play its first road game of the season when it travels to Philadelphia, Pa. to take on La Salle at 7 p.m. The contest will be broadcast on WCTC (1450 AM) with play-by-play announcer Ed Cohen and color analyst Mark Peterson.

LAST TIME

Rutgers junior center Monique Oliver recorded her third career double-double with 15 points and a game-high 10 rebounds as women's basketball defeated Boston College 74-58 on Wednesday night at the RAC. Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan also scored in double-figures with 15 points.

Rutgers led by as many as 19 points in the first half, taking a 34-15 lead over Boston College with 2:43 left to play in the opening period. For the second-straight game, Oliver led the offensive effort, scoring a team-best nine first-half points. Rushdan chipped in with eight points, while freshman guard Briyona Canty added eight off the bench.

The Scarlet Knights were fueled by defense in the first half, forcing 14 turnovers which resulted in 16 points. Most of those points came on the run as Rutgers posted 14 fast break points, while holding the Eagles without a single

fast break basket. RU also dominated in the paint, outscoring BC 28-12.

Rutgers went into halftime leading 40-23. The Eagles narrowed the gap following the intermission, outscoring RU 15-7 to open the second half. BC cut the Scarlet Knights' 17-point lead down to five as RU led 51-46 with 8:30 left on the clock.

RU stepped up its defensive intensity once again, forcing BC into five turnovers in the last seven minutes of play. Senior guard April Sykes scored nine of the team's final 16 points to give the Scarlet Knights a comfortable lead in the 16-point win (74-58).

Freshman forward Betnijah Laney added nine points, while classmates Shakena Richardson, Syessence Davis and Christa Evans scored four points apiece.

RUTGERS QUICK HITS

• Rutgers returns four of its five starters with the loss of forward Chelsey Lee. Among the returning starters are three Scarlet Knights who emerged into starring roles en route to earning Second Team All-BIG EAST honors.

• Rutgers made its return to the national rankings this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 pre-season AP poll at No. 25.

• Freshman Betnijah Laney made the first start of her collegiate career, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that a true freshman started the first game of the season, when Myia McCurdy started in the season-opener against Georgia.

• She recorded 18 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Usha Gilmore had 20 points in a 66-48 loss to Penn State on Nov. 24, 1996. Gilmore started the contest and logged 35 minutes in the game, shooting 9-19 from the floor, compared to Laney's 22 minutes and 7-19 from the field.

• The Scarlet Knights have had an outstanding track record of success at home during the previous nine seasons under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. Rutgers improved to 112-17 at the RAC since the 2002-03 season. RU lost just one game (12-1) last season on its home court.

• Freshmen Shakena Richardson, Briyona Canty, Betnijah Laney, Christa Evans and Syessence Davis all made their collegiate debuts on the afternoon, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that five freshman made their collegiate debuts in the season-opener - when DelaQuese Jernigan, Epiphanny Prince, Myia McCurdy, Britany Ray and Rashidat Junaid made their debuts.

• The Scarlet Knights tallied 17 steals against Cal, the most in a game since Feb. 11, 2009 vs. Farmingdale State. Wheeler shattered her previous career-high in steals (4) with a game-high six steals - the first time an RU player recorded six steals since April Sykes on Jan. 3, 2011.

• Against Cal, RU had four players score in double-figures for the first time since March 6, 2011. The Scarlet Knights' 73 points was the most scored by Rutgers in a season-opener since 2008 when RU defeated Saint Joseph's 86-59.

• Rutgers scored 70-plus points in back-to-back games to start the season. It marks the first time the team has accomplished that feat since the start of the 2008-09 season.

• Monique Oliver recorded her third-career double-double - her first since Feb. 1, 2011 against St. John's. RU improves to 18-7 all-time when Oliver reaches double-figures. Oliver has clogged up the stat sheet in back-to-back games recording at least one point, assist, rebound, block and steal.

SCOUTING RUTGERS

Rutgers returns four of its five starters with the loss of forward Chelsey Lee. Among the returning starters are three Scarlet Knights who emerged into starring roles en route to earning Second Team All-BIG EAST honors.

Junior center Monique Oliver leads the Scarlet Knights in scoring with a pair of standout performances in the first two games of the season. Oliver had a game-high 18 points in the opening win over Cal and followed that outing with a double-double, 15 points and 10 rebounds against Boston College. She is averaging 16.5 points per contest to lead RU.

Freshman forward Betnijah Laney has made a smooth transition to the college game, earning a start in the first game of the season. She had 18 points in her debut - the most by a freshman in their first career start since the 1996-97 season. Laney is second in scoring with 13.5 points per game.

Rutgers has four players averaging in double-figures with senior guards April Sykes (10.5 ppg) and Khadijah Rushdan (10.0 ppg) adding to the scoring output.

Oliver is the team's leading rebounder with 9.5 per game, followed by freshman guard Briyona Canty with 5.0. Rushdan paces RU in assists with 5.0 per contest.

The Rutgers defense has been the story in the early season as the Scarlet Knights have forced its first two opponents into a combined 45 turnovers. RU has scored 47 points off turnovers in two games

SCOUTING LA SALLE

La Salle (1-2) opened the season with a 63-43 victory over Lehigh, but has since dropped back-to-back games versus Albany (81-76) and St. John's (66-45).

The Explorers are led by Jada Payne's 12.7 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per game. The freshman guard/forward earned Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week honors for her performance in the season's opening weekend, averaging 15.5 ppg. and 5.5 rpg.

Junior transfer Jordan Mosley has recorded a team-best eight assists and six steals, while adding a double-digit scoring average of 10.7 per contest.

ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST LA SALLE

Rutgers is 3-1 all-time against La Salle, with the last meeting coming on Dec. 30, 1983, an 82-59 RU win, during the third round of the La Salle Christmas Tournament. The Scarlet Knights have won three-straight against the Explorers, posting 100-plus points in two of the three contests.

RUTGERS AGAINST THE ATLANTIC 10

The Scarlet Knights have matched up against nine teams that comprise the current Atlantic 10 Conference, having not faced Charlotte, Dayton, Richmond, Saint Louis and Xavier. RU will take on four A-10 teams this season - La Salle, Temple, Fordham and George Washington.

Rutgers is 192-41 all-time against the conference, including a 18-11 mark under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. The Scarlet Knights have never faced La Salle and Fordham with Stringer at the helm.

SCARLET KNIGHTS IN THE NATIONAL POLL

Rutgers made its return to the national rankings this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 preseason AP poll at No. 25.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is currently fifth on the all-time list of AP appearances with 390, just behind retired Texas Hall of Fame coach Jody Conradt at 395.

The Scarlet Knights are ranked 15th in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls.

Georgia Tech, Arizona State, Temple, Miami, Tennessee, Louisville, St. John's, DePaul, Georgetown, Connecticut, West Virginia and Marquette round out the remaining 12 teams on the schedule for the Scarlet Knights.

RUTGERS HAULS IN HIGHLY-TOUTED CLASS

Rutgers hauled in another nationally-recognized and highly-touted recruiting class with the addition of four standouts in the early signing period.

Four ESPNU HoopGurlz Top-100 prospects signed National Letters of Intent, for the 2012-13 season.

Rachel Hollivay • Columbus, Miss.

Hollivay, the No. 2 ranked post player and the eighth-rated recruit overall by ESPNU HoopGurlz, enters her second season with Heritage Academy (Miss.) after two seasons with New Hope High School. In her sophomore season at New Hope, the 6-4 post helped the Trojans to their first district championship in 18 years, averaging 13.0 points per game for the black and gold. Hollivay, a five-star prospect, was invited to Colorado Springs – on two occasions – for the U16 and U17 National Team Trials. Hollivay was also rated No. 11 in the country by Dan Oldson's Collegiate Girls Reports, a national scouting service.

Kahleah Copper • Philadelphia, Pa.

Copper, a 6-1 wing, will see familiar faces when she steps on campus next fall, having played club basketball with the NYC Gauchos, joining current Scarlet Knights Briyona Canty and Betnijah Laney. The No. 17 overall ranked player and the fifth-ranked wing player comes from Prep Charter in Philadelphia, where she helped the Huskies to a Public League Championship last season. In the 49-39 victory over Central in championship game, Copper scored a game-high 19 points and pulled down 17 boards en route to Most Valuable Player accolades.

Ariel Butts • Columbus, Ga.

Butts, a 6-3 post, averaged a triple-double during her junior season at Carver High School – 20 points, 18 rebounds and 10 blocks per contest. The Columbus, Ga. native is ranked 75th overall by ESPNU HoopGurlz Top-100 and is rated the ninth-best post player in the country.

Precious Person • Rex, Ga.

Person, a four-star recruit, is ranked No. 69 overall by ESPNU HoopGurlz and 28th at the guard position. Standing at 6-1, Person will bring a long, lean presence to the Scarlet Knights perimeter game. The Rex, Ga. native was the first player from her high school, Charles Drew, to sign a college scholarship, after helping the Lady Titans to the school's first Region 4-AAA Championship and a state playoff berth.

2010-11 SEASON REVIEW

Rutgers finished the year 20-13 overall and 11-5 in BIG EAST play. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament

against eventual National Champion Texas A&M. For head coach C. Vivian Stringer, it was her 31st 20-win season, second-most all time, including topping the 20-win mark in 12 of the last 14 seasons.

WE WANT SOME MO':

Monique Oliver emerged as a standout for the Scarlet Knights in the front court averaging 10.9 points per game. She went from 5.8 points per game as a freshman to her double-digit average. Oliver also improved from 3.3 rebounds per game to 5.9 per contest and averaged 2.0 blocks per game, which ranked second in the conference at the end of the regular season and was among the national leaders. Oliver recorded her first career double-double with 21 points and a career-best 17 rebounds against then-No. 11/12 Georgetown. She also had a double-double against St. John's with 22 points and 11 rebounds. Oliver ended the year with three 20-point games, including a career-high 27 point effort against Syracuse.

RUSHDAN SHOWS OFF ALL-AROUND GAME:

Khadijah Rushdan was a leader on both ends of the floor for the Scarlet Knights, averaging double-figures for the first time in her career with 11.8 points per game, including 18 games with 10 or more points and four 20-point games. Rushdan ranked first in the BIG EAST at the end of the regular season with a team-leading 5.2 assists per game. She had 12 games with six or more assists and posted eight in a contest on six separate occasions. In addition to career marks in points and assists, Rushdan also averaged a career-best 5.6 rebounds per game, tying her career-high of 10 boards four times. She recorded three double-doubles on the year but the highlight was becoming just the second Scarlet Knight to record a triple-double with 13 points, 10 assists and 10 rebounds against Pittsburgh, which broke a 10-year old record.

SYKES FINDS OFFENSIVE STROKE:

April Sykes nearly tripled her scoring average (5.6 ppg) and had three times as many double-digit scoring games (eight) from a year ago with 14.1 ppg and 24 double-figure contests. Sykes

had a streak of 12-straight games with 10-plus points. She entered the year with one 20-point game during her career and shattered that mark with seven 20-point efforts in 2010-11, including a career-high 32 points against Boston College. It was the first 30-point game for a Scarlet Knights since the 2007-08 season. Sykes led the squad shooting 37.6 percent from three-point range, which ranked ninth in the BIG EAST and in Rutgers single-season history.

LEE COMMANDS THE PAINT:

Chelsey Lee was a force in the paint for the Scarlet Knights all season long, leading the squad in rebounding with 7.5 per game. She grabbed seven or more boards in 22 games, had six double-digit rebounding games and was the team's leading rebounder in 19 contests. Lee also contributed on the offensive end with 8.5 points per game, including 16 double-figure scoring games. She posted a double-double in the season opener and went on to record a team-best five double-doubles, including three-straight.

WHEELER MAKES STRIDES AS SOPHOMORE:

Erica Wheeler increased her numbers from a year ago, averaging 9.7 ppg, 3.0 rpg and 1.7 apg as opposed to 3.4 ppg, 1.1 rpg and 0.7 apg as a freshman. An injury to starter Nikki Speed thrust Wheeler into the starting lineup as she earned starts in the final 21 games. She went from averaging 14.1 minutes per game as a freshman to 30.2 in her second season. With just three double-figure scoring games as a rookie, Wheeler established herself as a scoring threat with 10-plus points in 17 contests. She also eclipsed the 20-point mark for the first time in her career with 22 against West Virginia. Wheeler recorded multiple assists in 17 games, including eight with three or more.

SPEED SUFFERS INJURY, MISSES TIME:

Nikki Speed started the first 14 games of the season, averaging 6.9 ppg. She led the Scarlet Knights with 4.1 apg, 1.6 spg and was second in minutes per game with 30.6 at the time. However, Speed suffered an injury to her left foot and was sidelined for seven weeks, missing 11 games. Prior to her injury, Speed held a streak of 26 consecutive starts - most among all players at the time. She made her return to the court on Feb. 19 and went on to see action in the remaining eight games, but she struggled to find her form, averaging 1.8 ppg and 1.6 apg during the span.

C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 17th Season at Rutgers, 41th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, including her enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering her 41st season on the sidelines, Stringer was the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever

NCAA National Championship game.

The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 863-308 (.737), which ranks third on the Division I women's victories list and second among active coaches. In 2008, Stringer became just the eighth coach - men's or women's - to reach the 800-win mark and her 31 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania, "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball, but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

SUCCESS COMES QUICKLY TO "THE BANKS"

Stringer arrived at Rutgers in July of 1995 armed with a belief in the program's ability, calling it the "Jewel of the East" upon her hiring. After two years of gathering materials and going over blueprints, Stringer saw her plans begin to come together in 1998 when her team - filled with nine freshmen and sophomores - posted its first 20-win season in four years (22-10), winning the BIG EAST 7 Division title with a 14-4 regular-season record.

Following their first-ever BIG EAST crown, the Scarlet Knights gave a hint of what was to come when then-freshman Tasha Pointer made two late free throws to lift RU to a 62-61 win at Iowa State and advance to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

As if mapped out in her master plan, Rutgers continued its steady progression the next season. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out to the eventual national champion for the second-

consecutive year. They compiled a 29-6 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play to share the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Tabbed as the number-one team in the nation in the Street & Smith's 2000 Preseason Poll, Rutgers lived up to its billing as one of the top programs in the country, finishing the season with a 26-8 record, a 12-4 slate in the BIG EAST and a spot in its second BIG EAST Tournament championship game in three years. With their 59-51 upset of top-seeded Georgia in the NCAA Tournament West Region final, the Scarlet Knights advanced to their first-ever Final Four. For Stringer, who had declared her revelation five years earlier of leading Rutgers to the 2000 Final Four in nearby Philadelphia, there was a sense of triumph in fulfilling her dreams of making Rutgers a national contender.

The 2006-07 team was a young squad with no seniors and five freshmen. Stringer held fast on the group, teaching, shaping and leading the unit to the grandest stage, the Final Four and Rutgers' first appearance in a national championship game where it faced Tennessee.

In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights earned their ninth-straight NCAA Tournament berth, advancing to a second round matchup with eventual National Champion Texas A&M. The second round showing was the 11th under Stringer – in 16 years at RU – who also picked up her 31st 20-win season (second-most all-time).

From the first NCAA Championship game in 1982 to consistently putting together a team vying for the national crown, Stringer has helped to redefine the women's game.

WE ARE A FAMILY

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgers-based charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers — they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.
