### No. 11 Rutgers Opens Three-Game Homestand, Hosts Fordham

No. 11 Rutgers will return home to host a three-game stretch at the RAC, opening with Fordham on Thursday, Dec. 8. Tip-off is slated for 7:30 p.m. The contest can be seen live on RVision presented by AT&T with Danny Breslauer and Adam Helfgott calling the action. It will be broadcast on WCTC (1450 AM) with play-by-play announcer Ed Cohen and color analyst Mark Peterson, and can also be heard on the Rutgers Student Radio WRSU (88.7 FM) with Erik-Ray Sepulveda and Eric Idelson on the call.

#### LAST TIME

No. 11 Rutgers women's basketball dropped a double overtime nail-biter at No. 9 Miami, losing to the Hurricanes 92-81 on Monday at BankUnited Center. Junior center Monique Oliver had team highs with 23 points and 19 rebounds, while senior guard April Sykes also had a double-double with 19 points and 10 boards.

Rutgers entered the game as one of 15 unbeaten teams in the nation, while Miami was on a five-game win streak. Four Scarlet Knights scored in double figures as junior guard Erica Wheeler and senior guard Khadijah Rushdan added 13 and 10 points, respectively.

RU forced the first overtime on a Wheeler la-

yup with 1.5 seconds left in regulation as she put back a miss from Oliver in the closing seconds. The Scarlet Knights led by as much as 16 points in the second half, but a rally from the Hurricanes closed the gap with seven ties in the final 8:53 of the half.

Oliver scored 17 of her 23 points in the second half points, while Sykes paced RU in both overtimes, scoring 10 of the Scarlet Knights' 18 points in the final 10 minutes of play. Rutgers was without two of its most experienced guards in overtime after Rushdan and senior Nikki Speed fouled out in the second half.

Miami pulled away in the first overtime, taking a four-point lead with 38 seconds left on the

**RUTGERS QUICK HITS**

• Rutgers enters the national rankings this week at No. 11 in the Associated Press poll - the Scarlet Knights highest ranking since Nov. 17, 2008 when RU was rated No. 3 in the country.

• The 8-0 start for RU was the best since the 2005-06 season. It marked the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer.

• The 92 points scored by Miami marked the first time since Jan. 2, 2003 (Texas Tech, 94) that a Rutgers opponent scored 90-plus points in a game. RU entered the contest, holding opponents to 50.9 points per game.

• Rutgers played its first overtime game - including double-overtime - since March 7, 2010 when the Scarlet Knights defeated Georgetown 63-56 (2OT) in the BIG EAST Tournament.

• Junior center Monique Oliver (23 points, 19 rebounds) and senior guard April Sykes (19 points, 10 rebounds) each posted a double-double against Miami. The last time two Scarlet Knights had double-double performances in the same game was March 20, 2011 against Louisiana Tech (Khadijah Rushdan - 16 pts, 10 reb. and Chelsey Lee - 11 pts, 11 reb.).

• Senior guard April Sykes moved into a tie for eighth place on the all-time list for career three-point field goals made with 112. Sykes also took sole possession of seventh place in career three point field goal attempts with 372.

• Monique Oliver has a team-high three double-doubles this season. She is joined by April Sykes (two) and Betnijah Laney as the only other players with a double-double performance this season with one each. Laney became the first freshman to post a double-double since the 2008-09 season.

• Rutgers' 46 first-half points vs. Temple were the most scored by RU in a half this season and the most in a half since tallying 57 in the opening half against Kean on Dec. 15, 2010. Rutgers finished the period shooting .655 (19-29) from the floor, its highest percentage in a half since its shot .667 (16-24) in the second half against Central Connecticut on Dec. 5, 2010.

• The Scarlet Knights shot their highest percentage of the season against the Owls .549 (28-51). The last time RU shot better than that from the floor was against Seton Hall on Feb. 18, 2009 when they went 30-48 for a .625 clip

• Freshmen Shakena Richardson, Briyona Canty, Betnijah Laney, Christa Evans and Syessence Davis all made their collegiate debuts on the afternoon, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that five freshman made their collegiate debuts in the season-opener.

• Freshman Betnijah Laney made the first start of her collegiate career, marking the first time since the 2006-07 season that a true freshman started the first game of the season, when Myia McCurdy started in the season-opener against Georgia. She had 18 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Usha Gilmore had 20 points vs. Penn State on Nov. 24, 1996.

clock, however, the Scarlet Knights responded with a three pointer from Sykes, cutting the deficit to one (73-72). Riquna Williams connected on one of two free throws to pull Miami ahead by two with 20 seconds.

Rutgers scored its second game-tying shot moments later on a layup from freshman forward Betnijah Laney to make it 74-74 and enter the second overtime.

The Hurricanes found momentum in the final five minutes, outscoring the Scarlet Knights 18-7. Williams scored 16 of her career-high 36 points during OT to help propel Miami to the victory.

**SCOUTING RUTGERS**

The Scarlet Knights were on an eight-game win streak to open the season - their best start since the 2005-06 campaign.

Rutgers is led offensively by a trio of double-digit scorers in April Sykes, Monique Oliver and Khadijah Rushdan. Sykes paces the squad, averaging a team-best 13.9 points per game, followed by Oliver with 12.9 and Rushdan with 12.0 points per contest. Rushdan leads the team with 3.3 assists per outing.

Oliver leads the Scarlet Knights on the glass, averaging a career-best 8.6 rebounds per game. Sykes is second in rebounding with 9.8 boards per contest, while Sykes is averaging a career-high 6.0 and freshman Betnijah Laney adds 4.6 rebounds per game. Oliver also has a team-high 2.5 blocks per game.

Rutgers is ranked among the national leaders in a pair of defensive categories, rated 13th in field goal percentage defense and 18th in scoring defense.

**SCOUTING FORDHAM**

The Rams (5-3) snapped a two-game win streak with a 49-39 loss to Bucknell on Tuesday in Lewisburg, Pa. Arielle Collins was one of only two players in the game to reach double-figure points, poured in a game-high 16 in the defeat.

Fordham has three players averaging in double-digit points, Abigail Corning (12.0), Becky Peters (11.3) and Collins (10.3). Peters adds a team-high 6.4 boards per contest, while Collins leads the team with 25 assists and 14 steals.

**ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST FORDHAM**

Rutgers and Fordham will meet for the fifth time with the Scarlet Knights holding a 4-0 advantage in the all-time series. Thursday's contest will mark the first meeting between the two schools with C. Vivian Stringer at the helm of the RU program.

**RUTGERS AGAINST THE ATLANTIC 10**

The Scarlet Knights have matched up against nine teams that comprise the current Atlantic 10 Conference, having not faced Charlotte, Dayton, Richmond, Saint Louis and Xavier. RU scheduled four A-10 teams this season - La Salle, Temple,

Fordham and George Washington, having already earned wins against La Salle and Temple.

Rutgers is 194-41 all-time, including a 20-11 mark under Stringer. RU played La Salle for the first time this season with Stringer at the helm.

**SCARLET KNIGHTS IN THE NATIONAL POLL**

Rutgers made its return to the national rankings this season, entering the preseason Associated Press poll at 16 and holding the No. 17 spot in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

The Scarlet Knights were last ranked in the 2009-10 preseason AP poll at No. 25.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is currently fifth on the all-time list of AP appearances with 393, just behind retired Texas Hall of Fame coach Jody Conradt at 395.

The Scarlet Knights are ranked 11th in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls.

**DEFENSE IS THE HALLMARK FOR WINNING**

Florida entered the contest averaging 73.0 points through seven games. The Scarlet Knights held the Gators to 49 points - their lowest point total of the season at that point. Three of Florida's four double-digit scorers were held to single fig-

ure scoring totals, including leading scorer Jennifer George (13.4 ppg) who scored four points.

Rutgers' defense is ranked 28th in the nation, limiting opponents to 51.3 points per game. The Scarlet Knights have held five teams to 50 points or fewer.

**STARTING THE SEASON OFF STRONG**

Rutgers opened the 2011-12 campaign on an 8-0 streak - its best start since the 2005-06 campaign. This marks the fifth time in program history that the Scarlet Knights started the season with eight-straight wins and second time under head coach C. Vivian Stringer. (2005-06; 8-0), (1990-91; 13-0), (1986-87; 23-0) and (1983-84; 8-0).

**RUTGERS TAKES THE EARLY LEAD**

The Scarlet Knights have jumped out to an early lead, scoring the opening basket in six of eight games this season. Rutgers has also led wire-to-wire in four wins this year. RU has held double-digit leads in each of its seven games this season.

**PROTECTING HOME COURT**

**FILLING UP THE STAT SHEET**

Rutgers has six double-double performances on the season, coming from three different Scarlet Knights. Monique Oliver has a team-high three double-doubles, including a season high 23 points and 19 rebounds against No. 9 Miami. She entered the season with two for her career. April Sykes is second with two double-doubles, most recently with 19 points and 10 boards. Betnijah Laney has one double-double this season - the first of her career - to become the first freshman to achieve the mark in their rookie season since 2008.

**RUSHDAN TOPS 1,000-POINT MARK**

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan became the 30th player in Rutgers women's basketball history to score 1,000 points for her career. She entered the game against No. 9 Miami needing seven points to crack the plateau, posting 10 versus the Hurricanes.

**OLIVER HOSTING BLOCK PARTY**

Junior center Monique Oliver moved into the Rutgers record books in all-time blocked shots this season. She claimed sole possession of eighth place with 109 career blocks, surpassing Sandy Tupurins (1976-80) and Essence Carson (2004-08). Oliver is second in the BIG EAST averaging 2.6 blocks per game and ranks 28th nationally.

**SYKES FROM BEHIND THE ARC**

Senior April Sykes continues to climb the Rutgers record books as one of the best three-point shooters in school history. Sykes entered the top-10 list for career three point field goals made (eighth, 112) and three point field goals attempted (seventh, 372).

**REGULARS AT THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

Rutgers is one of only 10 teams in NCAA Division I to have qualified for the NCAA Tournament in

**BIENVENIDOS SAN JUAN**

Rutgers took its four-game win streak to San Juan, Puerto Rico and added two to the win column with victories over Georgia Tech (RV/25) and Arizona State at the San Juan Shootout.

Senior guard April Sykes was named the San Juan Shootout MVP following a 16-point and 10-rebound double-double against Georgia Tech. She followed that with a 14-point, five-rebound effort against Arizona State.

Senior guard Khadijah Rushdan was selected to the All-Tournament team, averaging 10.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

**LEE OUT FOR SEASON WITH INJURY**

Chelsey Lee will miss the 2011-12 season following shoulder surgery. The 6-2 forward has one year of eligibility remaining and will compete for the Scarlet Knights in 2012-13.

Lee was dominant in the paint for the Scarlet Knights last season, leading the squad in rebounding with 7.5 per game. She also contributed on the offensive end with 8.5 points per game, including 16 double-figure scoring games.

Lee grabbed seven or more boards in 22 games had six double-digit rebounding games and was the team's leading rebounder in 19 contests. She recorded a team-best five double-doubles. Lee has been the Scarlet Knights' leading rebounder in each of the past two seasons and averages 5.6 per game for her career.

**FAB FIVE MAKE DEBUT AS SCARLET KNIGHTS**

Rutgers once again assembled a nationally-ranked recruiting class with this season's freshmen rated the third-best group in the country.

The five-member class features four players ranked in the ESPNU HoopGurlz 100, including two rated in the top-10.

**850 WINS AND COUNTING**

Rutgers head coach C. Vivian Stringer collected her 850th career victory with a win over Kean on Dec. 15, 2010. Stringer became just the third women's coach to reach that plateau, joining Tennessee head coach Pat Summit and former Texas mentor Jody Conradt.

**2011-12 SCHEDULE POSED TOUGH TEST**

A hallmark of Rutgers basketball is its competitive schedule and this year's slate features that same philosophy. The Scarlet Knights will face 18 of 29 regular-season opponents that advanced to some form of postseason play last season.

The Rex, Ga. native was the first player from her high school, Charles Drew, to sign a college scholarship, after helping the Lady Titans to the school's first Region 4-AAA Championship and a state playoff berth.

**2010-11 SEASON REVIEW**

Rutgers finished the year 20-13 overall and 11-5 in BIG EAST play. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament against eventual National Champion Texas A&M. For head coach C. Vivian Stringer, it was her 31st 20-win season, second-most all time, including topping the 20-win mark in 12 of the last 14 seasons.

**WE WANT SOME MO':**

Monique Oliver emerged as a standout for the Scarlet Knights in the front court averaging 10.9 points per game. She went from 5.8 points per game as a freshman to her double-digit average. Oliver also improved from 3.3 rebounds per game to 5.9 per contest and averaged 2.0 blocks per game, which ranked second in the conference at the end of the regular season and was among the national leaders. Oliver recorded her first career double-double with 21 points and a career-best 17 rebounds against then-No. 11/12 Georgetown. She also had a double-double against St. John's with 22 points and 11 rebounds. Oliver ended the year with three 20-point games, including a career-high 27 point effort against Syracuse.

**RUSHDAN SHOWS OFF ALL-AROUND GAME:**

Khadijah Rushdan was a leader on both ends of the floor for the Scarlet Knights, averaging double-figures for the first time in her career with 11.8 points per game, including 18 games with 10 or more points and four 20-point games. Rushdan ranked first in the BIG EAST at the end of the regular season with a team-leading 5.2 assists per game. She had 12 games with six or more assists and posted eight in a contest on six separate occasions. In addition to career marks in points and assists, Rushdan also averaged a career-best 5.6 rebounds per game, tying her career-high of 10 boards four times. She recorded three double-doubles on the year but the highlight was becoming just the second Scarlet Knight to record a triple-double with 13 points, 10 assists and 10 rebounds against Pittsburgh, which broke a 10-year old record.

**SYKES FINDS OFFENSIVE STROKE:**

April Sykes nearly tripled her scoring average (5.6 ppg) and had three times as many double-digit scoring games (eight) from a year ago with 14.1 ppg and 24 double-figure contests. Sykes had a streak of 12-straight games with 10-plus points. She entered the year with one 20-point game during her career and shattered that mark with seven 20-point efforts in 2010-11, including a career-high 32 points against Boston College. It was the first 30-point game for a Scarlet Knights since the 2007-08 season. Sykes led the squad shooting 37.6 percent from three-point range, which ranked ninth in the BIG EAST and in Rutgers single-season history.

**WHEELER MAKES STRIDES AS SOPHOMORE:**

Erica Wheeler increased her numbers from a year ago, averaging 9.7 ppg, 3.0 rpg and 1.7 apg as opposed to 3.4 ppg, 1.1 rpg and 0.7 apg as a freshman. An injury to starter Nikki Speed thrust Wheeler into the starting lineup as she earned starts in the final 21 games. She went from averaging 14.1 minutes per game as a freshman to 30.2 in her second season. With just three double-figure scoring games as a rookie, Wheeler established herself as a scoring threat with 10-plus points in 17 contests. She also eclipsed the 20-point mark for the first time in her career with 22 against West Virginia. Wheeler recorded multiple assists in 17 games, including eight with three or more.

**SPEED SUFFERS INJURY, MISSES TIME:**

Nikki Speed started the first 14 games of the season, averaging 6.9 ppg. She led the Scarlet Knights with 4.1 apg, 1.6 spg and was second in minutes per game with 30.6 at the time. However, Speed suffered an injury to her left foot and was sidelined for seven weeks, missing 11 games. Prior to her injury, Speed held a streak of 26 consecutive starts - most among all players at the time. She made her return to the court on Feb. 19 and went on to see action in the remaining eight games, but she struggled to find her form, averaging 1.8 ppg and 1.6 apg during the span.

# C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 17th Season at Rutgers, 41th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, including her enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering her 41st season on the sidelines, Stringer was the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever

NCAA National Championship game.

The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 863-308 (.737), which ranks third on the Division I women's victories list and second among active coaches. In 2008, Stringer became just the eighth coach – men's or women's – to reach the 800-win mark and her 31 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania, "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball, but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

## SUCCESS COMES QUICKLY TO "THE BANKS"

Stringer arrived at Rutgers in July of 1995 armed with a belief in the program's ability, calling it the "Jewel of the East" upon her hiring. After two years of gathering materials and going over blueprints, Stringer saw her plans begin to come together in 1998 when her team - filled with nine freshmen and sophomores - posted its first 20-win season in four years (22-10), winning the BIG EAST 7 Division title with a 14-4 regular-season record.

Following their first-ever BIG EAST crown, the Scarlet Knights gave a hint of what was to come when then-freshman Tasha Pointer made two late free throws to lift RU to a 62-61 win at Iowa State and advance to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen.

As if mapped out in her master plan, Rutgers continued its steady progression the next season. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the Elite Eight before bowing out to the eventual national champion for the second-

consecutive year. They compiled a 29-6 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play to share the BIG EAST regular-season title.

Tabbed as the number-one team in the nation in the Street & Smith's 2000 Preseason Poll, Rutgers lived up to its billing as one of the top programs in the country, finishing the season with a 26-8 record, a 12-4 slate in the BIG EAST and a spot in its second BIG EAST Tournament championship game in three years. With their 59-51 upset of top-seeded Georgia in the NCAA Tournament West Region final, the Scarlet Knights advanced to their first-ever Final Four. For Stringer, who had declared her revelation five years earlier of leading Rutgers to the 2000 Final Four in nearby Philadelphia, there was a sense of triumph in fulfilling her dreams of making Rutgers a national contender.

The 2006-07 team was a young squad with no seniors and five freshmen. Stringer held fast on the group, teaching, shaping and leading the unit to the grandest stage, the Final Four and Rutgers' first appearance in a national championship game where it faced Tennessee.

In 2010-11, the Scarlet Knights earned their ninth-straight NCAA Tournament berth, advancing to a second round matchup with eventual National Champion Texas A&M. The second round showing was the 11th under Stringer – in 16 years at RU – who also picked up her 31st 20-win season (second-most all-time).

From the first NCAA Championship game in 1982 to consistently putting together a team vying for the national crown, Stringer has helped to redefine the women's game.

**WE ARE A FAMILY**

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgers-based charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers — they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.
