The Game

Week two of the 2010 season has Rutgers going to Miami to face the FIU Golden Panthers. The Scarlet Knights look to improve to 2-0 on the young season while the game for FIU is the season-opener for the Golden Panthers.

Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. from FIU Stadium in Miami.

ESPN Regional will produce the game. The contest will be televised live on SNY (New York City DMA) and WPVI-DT2 (Philadelphia DMA) and nationally on ESPN GamePlan and via the Internet at ESPN3.com. Mike Gleason (play-by-play) and John Congemi (color) have the call.

The Rutgers Radio Network begins pre-game coverage at 7 p.m. as Chris Carlin calls the action with WNBC-4 sports anchor and reporter Bruce Beck (color analyst) and Anthony Fucilli (sideline) on WOR-710 AM in New York City, WCTC-1450 AM in Central Jersey and 97.5 The Fanatic in Philadelphia and South Jersey. Ray Lucas is scheduled to miss the first month of broadcasts as he recovers from neck surgery.

Sirius Satellite Radio will broadcast the Rutgers Radio Network feed nationally on channel 130. In addition, WRSU will complete coverage of the game on 88.7 FM in New Brunswick.

Head Coach Greg Schiano

Rutgers head coach **Greg Schiano (Bucknell '88)** is in his 10th season with the Scarlet Knights. Schiano will be just the fourth coach in BIG EAST history to coach 10 seasons at the same school, joining Paul Pasqualoni (Syracuse, 14 years), Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech, 13 years) and Don Nehlen (West Virginia, 10 years). Schiano is the sixth-winningest coach all-time in victories in the BIG EAST (56-55).

Schiano will tie former Boston College head coach Tom O'Brien for fifth place in BIG EAST history in coaching victories with a win Saturday at FIU.

The 2006 National and BIG EAST Coach of the Year, Schiano has guided Rutgers to a school-record five consecutive bowl appearances, including four straight bowl victories.

Rankings

Rutgers and FIU are not ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Top 25 polls.

FIU Series

Rutgers leads the all-time series 1-0 after last season's 23-15 victory over FIU at Rutgers Stadium on Sept. 19. Joe Martinek rushed for 121 yards on 23 carries and Tim Brown caught four passes for 131 yards in the victory. The Scarlet Knights' defense registered five sacks and limited the Panthers to just 42 yards rushing in the victory.

BIG EAST schools are a perfect 16-0 all-time vs. Sun Belt institutions.

Next Game

Rutgers is off next week before returning to action Saturday, Sept. 25 at home vs. North Carolina.

Post-Game Interviews

Coach Schiano and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Coach Schiano's press conference will take place in the team meeting room of the Hale Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Hale Center.

Rutgers' locker room is open to the media following the cooling off period.

The visiting team's press conference will be held in the field hockey locker room, inside the Hale Center.

Player Interviews

All player interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day in advance. Players are available in person on Mondays at the weekly Rutgers Football Luncheon, and following practice on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, pending class schedules/availability.

Please consult with Jason Baum regarding availability. Player availability at other times will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and the member of the media can be set up by the Athletic Communications Office. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday until following the game.

Coach Schiano Interviews

All interview requests must be arranged through Jason Baum. Coach Schiano will be available to the media every Monday on the BIG EAST Coaches Conference call at 11 a.m., Tuesday at his weekly press conference at 1 p.m. in the team meeting room of the Hale Center and after practice on Wednesday and Thursday.

Covering Practice

Rutgers' preseason practices begin August 5. Throughout the season, practice will be open to the media for the first 30 minutes on Tuesday and Wednesday. Practice is closed to the media on Sunday and Thursday.

Filming at Practice

On Tuesday and Wednesday, video and photo access is available during individual periods of practice. Tripods are not permitted on the practice field and media members must stand at least five yards off the sideline.

Starting Strong in September

Rutgers is 20-14 (.588) overall under **Greg Schiano** in the month of September. Over the last five years - all seasons that concluded with bowl appearances - Rutgers is 15-6 (.714) in September.

In September home games since 2005, Rutgers is 12-4 (.750) overall. Last season, Rutgers was 3-1 in September.

For his career, Martinek has rushed for 1,480 yards in 27 career games, including an average of 4.9 yards per rush. He has scored 14 rushing touchdowns during his time "On the Banks."

Looking Back at a Successful 2009

- Rutgers finished the season 9-4 after a 45-24 victory December 19 vs. UCF in the St. Petersburg Bowl
- Defensively, Rutgers was ranked in the top 20 nationally in six different categories
- Rutgers was first nationally in fumbles recovered and tackles for loss and ranked second in turnover margin
- The Rutgers defense was also fourth in the nation in sacks, fifth in turnovers gained, ninth in first downs allowed, 10th in third down efficiency defense and 10th in fourth down efficiency defense
- Rutgers led the BIG EAST in total defense, scoring defense, turnover margin and tackles for loss
- With a true freshman starting at quarterback, Rutgers won nine games in a season for just the sixth time in school history, including a 31-0 victory over then 23rd-ranked USF

Watch Out for These Knights

Three Scarlet Knights have been included on the preseason watch list for several individual awards.

Sophomore quarterback **Tom Savage** was named to the preseason watch list for the Maxwell Award, recognizing the nation's top player, and the Davey O'Brien Award, given to the nation's best quarterback.

Sophomore wide receiver **Mohamed Sanu** was named to the preseason watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, awarded to the nation's most versatile player.

Redshirt sophomore tight end **D.C. Jefferson** was named to the preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award, honoring the nation's top tight end.

Welcome Back to Rutgers Stadium

The renovation of Rutgers Stadium was completed for the season-opener in 2009 vs. Cincinnati. The expanded stadium features more than 11,000 new seats in the south end zone, including a new HD scoreboard and sound system.

Dedicated on November 5, 1938, the original Rutgers Stadium featured seating for 23,000 spectators from 1938-1992. All-time, Rutgers was 168-53-4 in the original stadium.

The "new" Rutgers Stadium was expanded to seat 41,500 fans beginning in 1994. The venue featured the most memorable game in Rutgers history in 2006 as the Scarlet Knights kept their undefeated season alive with a 28-25 victory over No. 3 Louisville. All-time, Rutgers was 39-45 in the expanded venue.

With the seating capacity of 52,454, Rutgers looks to continue its recent winning ways at Rutgers Stadium in 2010.

The Scarlet Knights have a streak of six straight winning seasons at Rutgers Stadium, including a 21-8 mark since 2006.

Captains Named for 2010 Season

Howard Barbieri, **Joe Lefeged** and **Charlie Noonan** have been named team captains for the 2010 season. Barbieri and Noonan have been part of Rutgers' four consecutive teams that have won bowl games while Lefeged has played in the previous three bowl victories for the Scarlet Knights.

Howard Lending a Helping Hand Off the Field

Howard Barbieri was selected to the 19th annual Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. The team honors the distinguished group of college football players who stand out for the positive influence they have in their communities by the Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Barbieri is just one of several Scarlet Knights who are active in giving back to their local communities. The New Jersey native is active

in Special Olympics New Jersey, Read Across America and visiting children in local hospitals in the New Brunswick area. Last year, defensive back Billy Anderson was named to the team while Tiquan Underwood earned the AFCA Good Works Team accolades in 2008.

Overtime Record

Rutgers is 1-4 all-time in overtime games. In their last overtime game, the Scarlet Knights lost 41-39 in triple overtime at West Virginia on Dec. 2, 2006. Four of the five overtime games have come versus BIG EAST competition. The lone overtime win in school history for the Scarlet Knights was a 24-21 victory over Syracuse (11/13/99).

Two First Round Selections in 2009 NFL Draft

For the first time in school history, Rutgers had two student-athletes selected in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft in April. Junior offensive tackle Anthony Davis became the highest-drafted Scarlet Knight in history after being selected with the 11th overall pick by the San Francisco 49ers. Senior cornerback Devin McCourty followed Davis in the first round by going 27th overall to the New England Patriots.

Rutgers was the first BIG EAST school with two first round picks in the same draft since Miami and Virginia Tech in 2004.

For the second straight year, Rutgers had a player taken in the first round of the NFL Draft. Former All-America wide receiver Kenny Britt was the first player in school history to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft after the Tennessee Titans chose the New Jersey native with the 30th pick in last year's draft.

Davis was the third player in the Schiano era at Rutgers to leave school early and be selected in the NFL Draft.

Pro Bowl running back Ray Rice left Rutgers following his junior season in 2007 and was a second round draft selection of the Baltimore Ravens in the 2008 NFL Draft. Britt declared for the 2009 NFL Draft and was a first round pick of the Tennessee Titans.

Protecting the Pigskin

Rutgers is +29 in turnover differential over its last 21 games (17-4). The Scarlet Knights gained 34 turnovers in 2009, including at least one in 12 of the 13 games.

Rutgers finished second in the nation in turnover margin in 2009 [+1.54].

Over the last 21 games, Rutgers has gained a total of 52 turnovers.

Freshman All-America QB Tom Savage

Tom Savage was named Rutgers' offensive MVP following the 2009 season. Savage, a FWAA First Team Freshman All-America selection, finished the season with 2,211 passing yards and 14 touchdown passes. He finished sixth in Rutgers single-season history with 2,211 passing yards.

Savage joined an impressive list of quarterbacks who have been named the quarterback of the FWAA Freshman All-America squad. Some of the past FWAA Freshman All-America quarterbacks include Sam Bradford in 2007, Colt McCoy in 2006, Chad Henne in 2004 and Ben Roethlisberger in 2001.

He threw for the most yards by a true freshman in BIG EAST single-season history in 2009. He finished the season second nationally among all true freshman quarterbacks in passing yards and touchdowns.

FWAA Freshman All-America Honors for Vallone

Rutgers landed two players on the prestigious Football Writers Association of America 2009 Freshman All-America Team. Quarterback Tom Savage and redshirt freshman defensive tackle Scott Vallone were named to the team.

Rutgers was one of just two schools to have two players named to the team, along with Oregon. Of the 28 players honored, the team was exactly split between true freshmen and redshirt freshmen.

Savage and Vallone were the first Scarlet Knights named to the FWAA Freshman All-America Team since Anthony Davis in 2007. Courtney Greene was also selected as a FWAA Freshman All-America in 2005.

Vallone was a major force on Rutgers' defensive line in his first year as a starter. The New York native started all 13 games and finished 2009 with 41 tackles, including nine behind the line of scrimmage. He was a key cog in a Rutgers defense that is first nationally in fumbles recovered and tackles for loss and ranks second in turnover margin.

Scouting FIU

FIU opens its 2010 campaign, under the direction of fourth-year head coach Mario Cristobal, on Saturday against Rutgers. FIU finished 3-9 overall and 3-5 in conference action in 2009.

Offensively, the Golden Panthers return two of their top four rushers in junior Darriet Perry and sophomore Darrian Mallary. Perry was second on the squad with 301 yards on the ground with three touchdowns. Perry also caught 17 passes for 137 yards. Mallary carried 33 times for 104 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

FIU will be without Paul McCall, who played in 11 games. McCall threw for 2,243 yards and 14 touchdowns, connecting on 208 of 370 passes.

Junior wide receiver T.Y. Hilton was the team's leading receiver in 2009 having caught 57 balls for 632 yards and five touchdowns. He will be joined by fellow receivers Greg Ellingson and Jason Frierson to round out the top three returning receivers. Ellingson hauled in 34 passes for 528 yards and four TDs, while Frierson had 30 receptions for 368 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, FIU returns four of its top six tacklers from 2009. Sophomore defensive back Jonathan Cyprien was second with 78 tackles (48 solo, 30 assisted). He also had an interception on the season. Junior linebacker Aaron Davis had 59 tackles (45 solo, 14 assisted), including 7.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks. Senior linebacker Toronto Smith made 50 stops (27 solo, 23 assisted), 9.0 for a loss and 3.5 sacks, while senior defensive back Anthony Gaitor had 45 tackles, 4.5 for loss and two interceptions.

Series History

Rutgers and FIU will meet for the second time with the Scarlet Knights winning the inaugural matchup during the 2009 season. RU defeated FIU 23-15 at Rutgers Stadium. It also marks the second meeting between Rutgers head coach Greg Schiano and his former assistant Mario Cristobal, the head coach of FIU.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – Junior RB Joe Martinek rushed for 109 yards and a score to help Rutgers to a 31-0 win over Norfolk State Thursday before 46,311 fans in the season opener at Rutgers Stadium. The RU defense limited the Spartans to 156 total yards, including just 25 on the ground, in the shutout victory.

In addition to the strong defensive effort, which limited NSU to a 0-for-12 mark on third down conversions, specialty units also shined for the Scarlet Knights. Senior CB Brandon Bing blocked two punts that resulted in scores.

The Scarlet Knights generated 230 yards in the second half, posting 25 points. RU scored on all three of its trips inside the red zone and was a perfect five-for-five for the game.

San San Te split the uprights from 31 yards to produce a 3-0 edge with 7:30 on the first quarter clock.

With less than a minute to play in the second quarter the Scarlet Knights surged. A 28-yard punt return by Mason Robinson preceded Tom Savage passes to Mohamed Sanu of 26 and 29 yards, respectively, during a five-play, 49-yard drive. The second connection to the sophomore brought RU to within three yards of the goal line with just one second on the clock. After an official review, the home squad utilized that lone second to boot a 20-yard field goal to enter the locker room at the midpoint with a 6-0 advantage.

RU's initial touchdown of its young campaign came with 7:55 showing on the third quarter clock. A six-yard Martinek scoring scamper capped a seven play, 75-yard drive. The junior carried four times on the drive for 54 yards. A Sanu rush from the wildcat formation resulted in a successful two-point conversion and Rutgers led 14-0.

The Rutgers special teams, already having a productive evening, quickly increased the advantage. Bing blocked his second punt of the night and senior SS Joe Lefeged scooped the ball up at the NSU three-yard line and entered the end zone to set up a 21-0 advantage.

The next score landed in the hands of Sanu. Savage connected with the receiver on a 10-yard touchdown toss with 8:27 remaining to widen the divide to 28-0. The reception was the culmination of a methodical, 11-play, 70-yard drive.
