Satellite Radio: XM Radio Channel 203

For the first time in 138 seasons of football at Rutgers, the Scarlet Knights will face a team ranked in the top 10 for the second consecutive week as the 25th-ranked Scarlet Knights (5-2, 2-1 BIG EAST) host No. 6/6 West Virginia (6-1, 1-1 BIG EAST) Saturday at Rutgers Stadium. Kickoff is set for 12:10 p.m. with split national television coverage on ABC. Brad Nessler, Bob Griese, Paul Maguire and Bonnie Bernstein will broadcast the game for ABC.

It marks just the 10th time in Rutgers history - and the third under head coach Greg Schiano - that Rutgers will face a ranked team in consecutive weeks. Saturday's game features the first time a ranked opponent has played at Rutgers in consecutive weeks.

The win last week over No. 2 USF marked the highest-ranked opponent the Scarlet Knights have defeated. Rutgers stopped the Bulls 30-27 last Thursday night in primetime on ESPN.

West Virginia ran past Mississippi State 38-13 in Morgantown last Saturday to move to 6-1 on the season. The only blemish on the WVU schedule was a 21-13 setback at USF on Sept. 28.

The Rutgers Radio Network will begin broadcasting 30 minutes prior to kickoff with the pregame show at 11:30 a.m. The

game is also available nationally on XM Satellite Radio, channel 203.

Stopping the Top 10

Rutgers looks for its third consecutive victory vs. a team ranked in the top 10 Saturday vs. West Virginia. The Scarlet Knights topped No. 2 USF 30-27 last Thursday and defeated No. 3 Louisville 28-25 on Nov. 9, 2006 at Rutgers Stadium.

All-time, Rutgers is 2-25 vs. teams ranked in the AP Top 10.

Rutgers Football Media Policies

Player Interviews

- All player interviews must be arranged through Jason Baum or Doug Drabik in the Athletic Communications Office at least one day in advance. Players are available in person on Mondays at the weekly Rutgers Football Luncheon, and following practice on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, pending class schedules/availability.
- Please consult with Jason Baum or Doug Drabik regarding availability. Player availability at other times will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and the member of the media can be set up by the Office of Athletic Communications. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday until following the game.

Coach Schiano Interviews

- All interview requests must be arranged through Jason Baum or Doug Drabik in Athletic Communications. Coach Schiano will be available to the media every Monday on the BIG EAST Coaches Conference call at 12:20 p.m., Monday at the weekly Rutgers Football Luncheon and after practice on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Covering Practice

- Beginning August 23 and continuing throughout the season, practice will be open to the media for the final 25 minutes on Tuesday and Wednesday. Practice is closed to the media on Sunday.

Filming at Practice

- On Tuesday and Wednesday only, video and photo access is available during the final 25 minutes of practice during individual periods.
- Tripods are not permitted on the practice field and media members must stand at least five yards off the sideline.

Post-Game Interviews

- Coach Schiano and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Coach Schiano's press conference will take place in the team meeting room of the Hale Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box. With approximately two minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Hale Center.
- Rutgers' locker room is open to the media following the cooling off period.
- The visiting team's press conference will be held in the field hockey locker room, inside the Hale Center.

Weekly Press Luncheon

- Coach Schiano and selected players will be available each Monday at the Rutgers Football Luncheon. Coach Schiano will address the media from 12:30-1:00 p.m. while the players are available from 1:30-2:15 p.m.
- The luncheon will be held on the third floor of the Hale Center.

BIG EAST Teleconference

- The BIG EAST football coaches will hold a weekly teleconference for the media taking place each Monday during the season and concluding on November 19. Each coach will be available for approximately 10 minutes. Schiano will take part in the conference call at 12:20 p.m.

BIG EAST Weekly Satellite Feed

- The BIG EAST hosts a weekly satellite feed on Wednesday, concluding on Nov. 29. Approximately three and a half minutes of highlights and interviews are available for each team in the conference. Information on the feed is as follows:

Tiquan Terrific

Junior WR **Tiquan Underwood** had one of the best receiving days in BIG EAST history August 30 vs. Buffalo. The Lawrenceville, N.J., native set a new school single-game record with 248 receiving yards. He surpassed Jack Emmer's 13-catch, 237-yard performance on Nov. 16, 1966 at Holy Cross.

After finishing the 2006 season with 23 receptions for 290 yards and four touchdowns, he has 39 receptions for 789 yards and six touchdowns in 2007.

Underwood set career-highs in receptions (10) and yards (248) vs. Buffalo. He hauled in a 65-yard pass for his first touchdown of the contest in the first quarter and a 66-yard TD reception in the second quarter against the Bulls.

Underwood is also tied for seventh in Rutgers single-season history with six touchdown receptions.

Underwood is the first player in 138 seasons of football at Rutgers to record four consecutive games of 100 yards receiving to start the 2007 season. He surpassed **Bill Powell**, who achieved the feat on three-straight occasions from 10/3/98 - 10/24/98.

Running vs. the Bulls

Ray Rice has done something few running backs have done since the start of the 2005 season - run for 100 yards vs. the USF defense.

Rice became the first USF opponent in 15 games to rush for at least 100 yards against the Bulls with 181 yards on 39 carries in the 30-27 win on Oct. 18. In three career games vs. USF, Rice is averaging 180.3 yards rushing per contest.

Balance on Offense and Defense

Rutgers ranks in the nation's top 25 in eight different team categories. The Scarlet Knights are second in the nation in sacks allowed (0.71), fifth in passing efficiency (161.12), 13th in total offense (476.9) and 14th in passing offense (296.4).

Ray Rice became Rutgers' all-time leader in career rushing yards (3,913) and career rushing touchdowns (38) in 2007.

Currently, Rice leads the BIG EAST and is fourth nationally in rushing yards per game (142.7) and is fifth in the NCAA in scoring (12 ppg).

He is the only player this season in the nation to post four, three-touchdown games.

Rice is tied for sixth in Rutgers single-season history in 2007 with 13 rushing touchdowns through seven games. The New Rochelle, N.Y., native set Rutgers' career rushing touchdown record with his 35th career rushing touchdown in the Cincinnati game (Oct. 6).

Rice is tied for fifth in BIG EAST history with former West Virginia running back Amos Zereoue with 38 career rushing touchdowns.

Rice became the second player in Rutgers history to reach the 3,000-yard plateau with his 184-yard performance in the win over Buffalo on Aug. 30. Rice is second in BIG EAST history in career rushing yards (3,913).

Among the Nation's Best

Rice quickly developed into one of the top running backs in the nation last season and put himself into contention for the Heisman Trophy, finishing seventh in the voting. Rice, who rushed for 1,120 yards as a true freshman in 2005 - the fifth-best mark among true freshmen backs in the nation that year - recorded 10 100-yard games in 2006, including three 200-yard performances. Even more impressive, in 32 career games, Rice has 19 100-yard performances.

Catching Rice

Rice has added a new dimension to his game in 2007 - catching passes out of the backfield. After catching 12 passes for 95 yards in his first two years at Rutgers, Rice has posted 17 receptions for 175 yards and a touchdown in 2007. Here is a year-by-year breakdown of Rice's receiving totals:

Going for Three Straight 1,000-Yard Seasons

Rice became just the third player in Rutgers history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons with his 225-yard game at Pitt last year. Rice finished the 2005 campaign with 1,120 yards and 1,794 yards in 2006.

Only Terrell Willis (1993-94) and "JJ" Jennings (1972-73) have also recorded consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

Rice is one yard shy of becoming the first player in 138 years of football at Rutgers to record three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

Big-Play Offense

Rutgers scored 42 points in the second quarter in the win over Norfolk State. The 42 points set a new BIG EAST record for points in a quarter. It also established a school record according to the latest statistics available dating back to the 1979 season.

The Scarlet Knights' 42 second quarter points were compiled via 12 offensive plays that generated 261 yards and consumed just 1:31 of the game clock.

The 45 points scored by Rutgers in the first half were the sixth-most in BIG EAST history.

In all, Rutgers has totaled 36 plays of 25 yards or longer in 2007. In 13 games last season, Rutgers totaled 38 plays of 25-plus yards.

Kenny Britt is quickly becoming one of the elite wide receivers in the BIG EAST and the nation. The Bayonne, N.J., native leads Rutgers with 10 25-yard plus plays in 2007.

Britt had more total yards by himself than the Orange after the first half of play. Britt had 176 yards receiving in the first half vs. Syracuse while the Scarlet Knights limited the Orange to 167 yards of total offense in the half.



Shutting Down Selvie

The Judge

Senior PK **Jeremy Ito** became Rutgers' all-time leader in scoring and field goals in 2006 to cap off one of the best seasons in school history by a place-kicker. Ito, who hit two game-winning field goals vs. USF and Louisville, was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2006.

In 2007, Ito was named a Preseason All-American by Playboy Magazine. This season, Ito is 12-for-16 in field goals and a perfect 31-for-31 on PATs. He is perfect from 40 yards or under this season, going 9-for-9.

He is tied for the lead among active players in the NCAA in career field goals with 69 and is second with 347 career points.

In the win over No. 2 USF, Ito connected on a 51-yard field goal to become the BIG EAST's all-time leader with 69 career field goals. He also completed a 36-yard pass on a fake punt in the win over the Bulls.

With his next field goal, Ito would become just the 19th player in NCAA history to record 70 field goals.

**Scouting This Week's Opponent:
West Virginia**

West Virginia, ranked sixth in the AP and USA Today Polls, enters Saturday's contest 6-1 overall and 1-1 in BIG EAST play.

The Mountaineers' only loss this season came at the hands of then-No. 18 USF. The Bulls upset WVU, which was ranked fifth at the time, 21-13 on Sept. 28.

WVU is led by a high-powered backfield that features a pair of preseason Heisman candidates in Steve Slaton and Pat White.

The group is second nationally in rushing offense, averaging 304.1 per game. Slaton is third in the conference with 107.4 yards per game, while White averages 71.4 yards from the quarterback position. White is also sixth in the nation (2nd in BE) in pass efficiency (161.8).

The Mountaineer defense is nationally ranked in the top 10 of several categories, including total defense (fourth), pass defense (fifth) and scoring defense (10th).

In addition to leading the conference in both total defense and pass defense, WVU is also tied for fourth in takeaways (T-14, nationally).

Series History

Saturday marks the 35th meeting in a long-standing rivalry between Rutgers and West Virginia.

Although the Mountaineers hold a sizeable advantage in the all-time series (28-4-2), including winning the last 12 games, both teams met in a tightly-contested affair last season.

With the BIG EAST Championship on the line, the Scarlet Knights stood toe-to-toe with the Mountaineers in a game that lasted nearly four hours and required three overtime periods to declare a winner before WVU won 41-39.

- Rice has scored 38 career rushing touchdowns in 32 games at Rutgers.

- He is the second player in Rutgers' 138 years of playing football to have consecutive 1,000-yard seasons and to reach the 3,000-yard plateau.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Heisman Trophy candidate Ray Rice (New Rochelle, N.Y.) rushed for 184 yards and three touchdowns, while junior Tiquan Underwood (Lawrenceville, N.J.) caught 10 passes for a school-record 248 yards and two scores to help No. 16 Rutgers to 38-3 season-opening win over Buffalo before 43,091 fans. The victory marked the Scarlet Knights eighth straight win within the confines of Rutgers Stadium and marked the team's fifth consecutive home opening victory under reigning national coach of the year Greg Schiano.

Rice's rushing output marked his 16th career 100-yard game and gives him 3,098 career rushing yards, 16 shy of Rutgers carrying code Terrell Willis (3,114). His 41-yard touchdown scamper in the third quarter finished a five play, 71-yard drive and gave the Scarlet Knights a 35-3 lead.

Jeremy Ito (Loma Linda, Calif.) added a 38 yard field goal in the fourth quarter to provide the final margin of victory.

The Scarlet Knights generated 378 total yards in the opening half, while Buffalo managed 74. Rutgers' 21 points in the first quarter marked the most points it had scored in an opening stanza since RU also posted 21 against Princeton at home on September 27, 1980 in a 44-13 victory.

Buffalo registered its only points on a 35-yard A.J. Principe field goal with 2:55 remaining in the third quarter to cap an eight play, 43 yard drive. The three points marked the lowest opening-day scoring by an opponent since a 21-3 RU defeat of Temple on September 13th, 1980.

#15/16 Rutgers 41, Navy 24

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Heisman Trophy candidate Ray Rice (New Rochelle, N.Y.) rushed 37 times for 175 yards to become the all-time rushing leader in Rutgers history in a 41-24 victory over Navy. The junior running back had both rushing and receiving touchdowns en route to three scores, as the No. 15/16 Scarlet Knights captured their ninth straight home victory.

Rice topped former career rushing leader Terrell Willis (1993-95; 3,114) on his second carry of the game. His output signaled his 17th career 100-yard performance on the ground, fifth most in BIG EAST history. His record-breaking night came before 43,514 fans, the third largest crowd in Rutgers Stadium history.

Leading by 10 points in the fourth quarter against a feisty Navy squad, the game was far from put away. Rutgers (2-0) junior quarterback Mike Teel (Oakland, N.J.) then connected with sophomore wideout Kenny Britt (Bayonne, N.J.) on a 53-yard touchdown pass to provide a 34-17 lead. The long distance connection with 9:05 remaining extinguished any hopes of a late comeback by the Midshipmen and supplied the necessary comfort to a raucous Scarlet crowd.

Rutgers generated 476 yards, while Navy totaled 289. Defensively, the Scarlet Knights had four players post double figure tackles, including junior linebacker Kevin Malast (Manchester, N.J.), who had a game-high 13 stops.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Heisman Trophy candidate Ray Rice (New Rochelle, N.Y.) rushed for three touchdowns to help No. 13 Rutgers to a convincing 59-0 homecoming victory over Norfolk State at Rutgers Stadium. Wide receivers Tiquan Underwood (Lawrenceville, N.J.) and Kenny Britt (Bayonne, N.J.) each exceeded the century mark and hauled in touchdown passes to provide the Scarlet Knights their 10th straight home win before a school-record fifth-consecutive sell out crowd.

The offense did the majority of its damage in the second quarter, scoring a school and Big East record 42 points en route to a 45-0 halftime lead.

Rice watched the second half from the sideline after rushing for 72 yards on 12 carries in the first two quarters. Quarterback Mike Teel (Oakland, N.J.) also retired after the midpoint. The junior once again engineered an efficient offense, completing eight of 15 passes for 269 yards and three scores, an average of 33.6 yards per pass. All of Teel's passes were caught by Underwood and Britt, with each grabbing four. Underwood, the Big East's leading receiver, totaled 148 yards and one touchdown, while Britt tallied 121 yards and two scores.

The 59-point differential marked the largest margin of victory during the Schiano era. The previous record was 49 in Rutgers 56-7 win over Howard on Sept. 23, 2006. The win also signaled the largest shutout in the Schiano era, beating the old record, a 44-0 win over Army on Sept. 14, 2002. The 59-0 total also marked the largest shutout since Rutgers beat Buffalo by the same score on Sept. 9, 2000.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Junior wide receiver Tiquan Underwood (Lawrenceville, N.J.) had his school-record fourth straight 100-yard receiving game, grabbing eight passes for 101 yards and a score, but it was not enough as Maryland upset the No. 10-ranked Scarlet Knights 34-24 at Rutgers Stadium. The Terrapins had possession of the ball for nearly 14 more minutes than their hosts and entered the red zone seven times, scoring on six occasions to issue Rutgers its first home loss since a 45-31 defeat to South Florida on November 5, 2005.

43,803 fans attended the game, marking the second largest crowd in school history. It was the sixth consecutive sell out for the Scarlet Knights.

Heisman Trophy candidate Ray Rice (New Rochelle, N.Y.) rushed for 97 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries. After gaining 62 yards in the opening quarter, however, the Maryland defense was able to find a measure of success against the Rutgers rushing attack and prevented any breakout runs. Despite not reaching the 100-yard mark Rice did, however, achieve yet another milestone. He tied J.J. Jennings for the most rushing touchdowns in school history with 34 when he carried one yard to pay dirt in the fourth quarter.

Junior quarterback Mike Teel (Oakland, N.J.) once again turned in a solid performance leading the Rutgers offense. He completed a career-best 25 passes on 44 attempts en route to 310 yards and two touchdowns.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - No. 20/24 Cincinnati scored 14 points off turnovers to defeat the No. 21-ranked Scarlet Knights 28-23 at Rutgers Stadium in the BIG EAST opener for both schools. Junior quarterback Mike Teel (Oakland, N.J.) threw for a career-high 344 yards and sophomore wide receiver Tim Brown (Miami, Fla.) posted a career-best 127 receiving yards, but it was not enough, as Rutgers lost consecutive games for the first time since 2005.

Rutgers seventh consecutive sell-out crowd went home disappointed, but not without a thrilling show. Trailing 28-23 with 2:13 remaining, Rutgers gained possession at its own 20-yard line looking to achieve its first, fourth quarter, come-from-behind victory since its 28-25 win over Louisville last season. Teel proceeded to complete five consecutive passes, leading his team inside the Cincinnati red zone. Faced with a second-and-three at the 17, however, his pass was intercepted by linebacker Ryan Manalac. The aerial theft sealed the win for the Bearcats and upped their record to a perfect 6-0 on the season.

Rutgers (3-2) posted 432 total net yards, while Cincinnati generated 407. One of the more telling statistics of the evening, however, was field position. Rutgers' average field position was its 22-yard line, while Cincinnati's average field position was its 36. In addition to turnovers, some of the disparity can be attributed to the fact that the Scarlet Knights averaged just 26.8 net yards per punt, while the Bearcats netted 41.5.

A line drive attempt from Ito for 51 yards cleared the crossbar to give Rutgers a 30-20 lead with 11:59 showing on the game clock.
